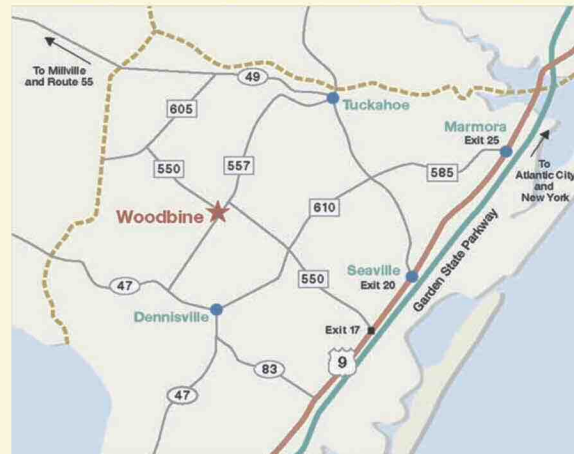
DIRECTIONS:

FROM THE NORTH

Garden State Parkway to Exit 17. Make left off the exit. Continue to traffic light, Rt. 9. Make right and continue on Rt. 9 North to the next traffic light, Rt. 550 West/Woodbine-Oceanview Rd. Make left. Continue on 550 to downtown Woodbine. Make left onto Washington Ave. The Museum will be on the right.

FROM PHILADELPHIA

Rt. 42 South to Rt. 55 South to exit for Rt. 49. Make left off the exit and take Rt. 49 East all the way to the traffic light at Woodbine Rd./Rt. 557 - approximately 13 miles. Make right onto Woodbine Rd. and follow into Woodbine. The Museum will be on your right.

Our Mission

The Sam Azeez Museum honors the harmonious community of Woodbine, which was founded in 1891 through the philanthropy of German industrialist Maurice de Hirsch. The Baron de Hirsch Fund was established to rescue Russian Jews from the poverty and oppression they endured under the rule of the Czar. Russian Jewish immigrants are documented as the first settlers of Woodbine, the founding fathers who removed a forest and built a legacy that remains more than a century later. Hate, prejudice, and intolerance were serious issue in 1891 and remain today. Our mission is to introduce the story of the wave of immigration, to discuss the impact of hate and prejudice, and to focus on tolerance and acceptance. As the designated teaching center for the NJ commission on Holocaust and Genocide Education, we provide Holocaust education to students through direct contact with survivors, on-site group visits, school assembly programs, and individual classroom workshops. The subject of tolerance and acceptance is the core theme of our educational curriculum.
