R.I.S.E. Structure:

- R.I.S.E. Leadership Team:
 - Student Affairs – Office of the Vice President of Student Affairs, Career Education, Office of Student Transitions,
 - Institutional Research
 - Academic Affairs, Washington Internship Program, Global Engagement, CTLD, Registrar/Advising, Faculty.
- R.I.S.E. Working Groups:
 - Assessment
 - Academic Integration – connection to ELOs, identify/create early opportunities for participation in R.I.S.E. participation to eliminate barriers.
 - Marketing

Project Goals and Timeline

Spring 2022

- Inventory existing R.I.S.E. practices occurring in both curricular and co-curricular activities.
 - Codify student involvement and retention (emphasis on SA).
 - Review course syllabi to capture R.I.S.E. practices occurring in coursework.
 - Work with faculty to diversify the array of R.I.S.E. offerings – and introduce them earlier in the curriculum.
 - Engage academic schools in creating and enhancing opportunities for students to experience different R.I.S.E. practices. – Academic/Faculty working groups
 - **Define Internships and other experiential learning.**

Summer 2022 Soft Launch

- Finalize definitions of R.I.S.E. activities
- Campus Awareness
- Review of assessment of existing R.I.S.E. practices and share with schools.

Next Steps:

- **Soft Launch Spring/Fall 2022:**
 - Finish assessment of work in AA and SA that are R.I.S.E. activities.
 - Develop a system to codify R.I.S.E. activities at Stockton.
 - Continued promotion to schools and campus stakeholders; increase opportunities for stakeholder involvement.
 - Identify faculty to serve on academic integration committee.
 - Continued development of PD for Faculty and Staff to support R.I.S.E. Initiatives.
- **Fall 2023 Hard launch:**
 - Curricular changes are reflected in curriculum and Bulletin.
 - Continued promotion to student stakeholder groups with emphasis on bridging equity gaps.
