Conditional Dual Admission to Stockton University and Atlantic Cape Community College

Purpose

The purpose of this Conditional Dual Admission Agreement (hereafter "Agreement") is to enable students who enter Atlantic Cape Community College (hereafter Atlantic Cape) with an interest in completing an Associate degree from Atlantic Cape and a concurrent interest in completing a degree offered by Stockton University to complete both degrees.

Terms of Conditional Dual Admission

Under terms of this agreement, any student residing in the counties of Atlantic or Cape May who is denied admission to Stockton University directly out of high school will be offered conditional admission as a transfer student to Stockton University. Stockton University will outline the parameters of this admission in their denial letter to students.

Admission to Stockton University is contingent upon:

- (a) successful completion of the A.A., A.S., or A.A.S. degree at Atlantic Cape, having
- (b) maintained a 2.5 or better cumulative grade point average at Atlantic Cape in all courses taken at Atlantic Cape, while
- (c) achieving a grade a "C" or better in any program pre-requisites in which the student wishes to matriculate at Stockton University.

First time Atlantic Cape students will have the opportunity to be conditionally admitted, upon request by the student, to Stockton University.

Under this conditional dual admission agreement, the application fee for Stockton will be waived.

Students who choose to apply to the program must complete a *Conditional Admission Application and Academic Record Release Form* waiver allowing Atlantic Cape to share academic records with Stockton University (grades, warnings, grade point average, and other such appropriate information related to progression toward the Associate degree).

Atlantic Cape shall submit to Stockton University, upon the student's completion of 24 college-level credits, a list of dual applicant students (with necessary directory and communication information). Upon receipt of such information (including a copy of the *Conditional Admission Application and Academic Record Release Form*, the Stockton Office of Admissions will mail Atlantic Cape conditional admission applicants a letter of welcome with notification of their acceptance into the conditional admission degree program; parameters and guarantees of the program will be outlined for the student.

Under terms of this Agreement, Atlantic Cape students electing upon first registration conditional dual admission will be assigned a Stockton University Academic Advisor in

the Center for Academic Advising, Atlantic Cape students should plan to complete lower division pre-requisites for the program in which they wish to matriculate at Stockton University, as specified in existing or future articulation agreements.

Representatives of Stockton University will meet as needed to facilitate the effective transition of Atlantic Cape graduates.

Students electing this conditional dual admission opportunity should indicate their intention to progress to Stockton no later than July 1 for a fall semester start or December 1 for a spring semester start. This lead time may be necessary to assist with academic support planning.

Atlantic Cape fees and tuition shall apply during matriculation and degree completion at Atlantic Cape. Stockton University fees and tuition shall apply upon degree completion at the Associate level and thereafter.

"C" or Better in Major Courses While at Stockton University

Failure to maintain a "C" or better in all designated course requirements may result in requiring completing additional courses with a "C" or better or the retake of courses in which a "C" or better was not earned. Such additional courses and/or retakes may result in the need to complete more than 128 credits.

Once admitted to Stockton University, students are subject to the academic performance requirements of Stockton University.

Continued On-Going Mutual Discussion of Curricula

Atlantic Cape and the Stockton shall annually review degree programs and existing articulation agreements and assess whether any substantive changes may have taken place that should require a review and update of this Agreement.

Special Conditions


Under the policies of this Agreement, Atlantic Cape is responsible for providing 100 and 200 level courses while Stockton University is responsible for providing 3000 and 4000 level courses. Stockton University will, by terms of this Agreement, work with Atlantic Cape toward the development of equivalent Atlantic Cape courses to be offered by Atlantic Cape at the 200 level should Atlantic Cape academic leadership desire the development of their own courses in this content area.

Students completing an A.A.S. degree from Atlantic Cape may be required to take more than 128 credits dependent upon the program they choose at Stockton University.


Review of Agreement


This agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years and must be reviewed and extended (or renewed) during its fourth year, with extensions presumed to be approved.

Both Atlantic Cape and Stockton University commit to resolve unidentified issues and challenges in a manner that ensures the greatest educational opportunity while recognizing fiscal constraints that may emerge. Cancellation of the Agreement may be initiated by either party, must be in writing, and must provide a prior full academic year notice of dissolution. For the purposes of such notice, July 1 shall be the date by which cancellation may occur on July 1 the following year (for fall semester-spring semester sequence) and January 1 shall serve as the notification date for dissolution the following January 1st (for spring semester-fall semester sequence).
