

PROGRAM COURSES: 40 credits

CORE REQUIRED COURSES for all Historical Studies majors:

HIST 2129 Introduction to the Study of History (4 credits) (Must be taken at Stockton)

At least one 1000-3000 level course in each category (20 credits):

NOTE: One and only one course at the 3000 level may satisfy a geographic distribution course requirement while simultaneously satisfying the 3000-4000 level course requirement (see below).

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

Proficiency through the Intermediate II level: this often requires 16 credits in LANG (two Beginning courses and two Intermediate courses).

See the <u>Catalog of Courses</u> for Languages and Culture Studies courses.

Successful participation in an approved study abroad in non-English speaking country for at least one semester or at least six weeks during the summer may be substituted for all or part of the language requirement.

A minimum grade of C or better is required for all program and cognate courses counted toward the 64 program and cognate credits required for graduation.

GENERAL STUDIES REQUIREMENT: 32 credits

25 % of all the courses a student takes at Stockton must be General Studies courses.

For all first-year students and transfer students with fewer than 64 credits (B.A. degree), the following courses are required.

General Arts and Humanities (GAH)—8 credits

General Interdisciplinary (GEN) — 4 credits

General Integration and Synthesis (GIS)* — 4 credits

General Natural Science and Mathematics (GNM) — 8 credits

General Social Science (GSS) — 8 credits

*Must be taken in junior or senior year

No more than 16 credits in any "G" category may be applied toward the B.A. degree.

AT-SOME-DISTANCE ELECTIVES REQUIREMENT (Courses unrelated to your major): 32 credits
