Admission Requirements

- Possession of a bachelor's degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA, 3.0 GPA in their major
- Applicants with a bachelor's degree are required to have a minimum of one 3-credit course in the areas of English, Math, Biology, and Psychology
 - None of these four classes may be a CLEP (College Level Examination Program) they must be taken as college-level credit bearing classes
- The program also prefers course work in history, sociology, political science, anthropology, and economics
- Three recommendation forms
 - Recommendations must be submitted by professional references, and not by friends or relatives
- Personal Narrative in response to the questions on the Autobiographical Statement Form
- Applicants may be required to attend an interview as part of the admissions process


