

DIRECT VERSUS INDIRECT

METHODS OF ASSESSMENT



Requires students to represent, produce, or demonstrate their learning

Most effective method of assessment when measuring achievement of learning outcomes

Examples include tests, portfolios, presentations, lab reports, projects

Use to determine how well learning outcomes are being met.



Captures information about students' perceptions of their learning

Provides insight into students' views of what they are learning

Examples include surveys, observations, self-reflections, journals

Use as a complement to direct assessment methods for a more comprehensive view of the learning experience.
