

NJDOE Update: edTPA and Clinical Hours



The Department has updated its web site to organize information by target audience. The section for [Educators](#) contains in-service and pre-service educator information.

After a full year of public hearings, the New Jersey Board of Education adopted changes to teacher preparation regulations that require a new performance assessment for licensure and increased clinical hours in P-12 schools.

The NJDOE selected a single vendor to administer the performance assessments, edTPA, developed by SCALE at

Stanford and delivered online by Pearson. By Fall 2017, all student teachers seeking licensure must pass the edTPA, which includes student work samples, lesson plans, and video recording of candidate teaching.

In addition, by the 2018-19 academic year, all teacher preparation students must complete 50 hours of clinical experi-

ence (observation, small group instruction, classroom assistance) before beginning 175 hours of clinical practice (Intro and Intermediate Student Teaching) that must be completed before the full time semester of Student Teaching.

This spring we will begin our first pilot of the state-

selected vendor for student teacher performance assessment, edTPA (Stanford-developed, Pearson-delivered). We thank our partners in Somers Point, Hamilton Township, and Toms River Schools for beginning the first stages of this journey with us. We will be seeking additional pilot sites for the Fall semester. Please contact us if you are interested in piloting edTPA ahead of the state's Fall 2017 implementation date.

We are also proud to welcome our first new class of doctoral students in Organizational Leadership. As we begin this journey together, we look forward to the perspectives that each brings

from their diverse organizational settings in P-12 schools, higher education, law enforcement, corporate businesses, military personnel, and faith-based organizations.
