Suggested Language Regarding Library Resources in "Proposal Outline for New Academic Degree Programs"

Over the years, many new programs have mushroomed along with the growth of the institution (see chart below). New programs demand additional resources. Yet, rarely do program proposals address their needs in library resources. This results in insufficient funding for the library to support the programs once they are established.

It is best that schools/programs work with the library to examine whether the library has the needed resources such as databases, full-text access, primary journals, books, etc. This is critical in securing from the university administration a commitment to the necessary resources, including funding, to satisfy programs' educational and research needs.

The library suggests that relevant language be reflected in the "Program Resources" section of the "Proposal Outline for New Academic Degree Programs." Suggested language:


