A degree may be awarded posthumously under the following conditions:

- 1. At least seventy-five percent of the program faculty in which the student was enrolled agree that the student should receive the posthumous degree.
- 2. The program in which the student was enrolled, as well as the Office of the Provost, will agree to waive any remaining degree requirements.
- 3. The posthumous degree is noted in the commencement program but not on the diploma.
