POLICY:

A degree may be awarded posthumously under the following conditions:

1. At least seventy-five percent of the program faculty in which the student was enrolled agree that the student should receive the posthumous degree.
2. The program in which the student was enrolled, as well as the Office of the Provost, will agree to waive any remaining degree requirements.
3. The posthumous degree is noted in the commencement program but not on the diploma.
