# **IDEA Delivery Method Pilot**

To test the effectiveness of delivery methods, the survey team conducted a pilot at the end of the fall semester of 2016:

- 6 courses
- Tenured faculty only
  - Opt out of having results used in faculty files
- Results separated from the regular course evaluations
- Options for administering the survey:
  - Mobile devices or computer lab in class
  - Computer lab or student device outside of class



#### **PILOT RESULTS**

#### **Two Survey Groups:**

- Asynchronous IDEA Administration (outside of a face-to-face class on personal device or computer)
- Synchronous IDEA Administration(face-to-face in-class on personal device or in a computer lab)





# **Asynchronous Group**

- 3 tenured faculty members
- 3 course surveys
- 83 students enrolled/42 responses
- 50.6% Response Rate
- 5-day survey window period
- 5 additional questions added to surveys

#### **Additional Comments**

- "Taking these surveys online makes this process feel [quicker] and doesn't waste too much time because I have the ability to take it when I want."
- "The survey doesn't flip to landscape on my iPad. I had to have my iPad vertical. Not a huge issue just something I noticed."





# **Faculty Feedback**

Was the IDEA *online* delivery method convenient/inconvenient, and in what ways?

- Inconvenient because I don't know if students completed it
- Convenient because I don't have to use class time for evaluations

Please share any additional feedback you received from students about *online* delivery of IDEA.

- Would like real time tracking.
- Evaluation time period was too short.



# Synchronous Group

- 3 faculty members
- 3 course surveys
- 46 students enrolled/ 43 responses
- 93.48% Response Rate
- In class module (only) survey window period
- 5 additional questions added to survey

Online Surveys: 20/43 (46.51%) Paper Surveys: 6/43 (13.95%) No Preference: 17/43 (39.53%) Which method for completing a student evaluation survey do you prefer: online or paper?

Online: 38/43 (88.37%)

Paper: 5/43 (11.63%)





# Faculty Feedback -Format

- Prefer to have students complete IDEA [on devices] in a [face-to-face]class
- Students [seemed to prefer] doing the IDEAs online in a [face-to-face] class setting
- Liked going to a lab, as a class, to take the IDEAs
- Students spent less time taking the survey on devices [than paper]
- Higher Response Rate [for in-class delivery on device]
- No [apparent] significant difference in IDEA scores [between delivery methods]
- Dedicating a lab or two to IDEAs during the evaluation time period would be a good idea
