

Performances

For the purposes of these regulations, “performances” include, but are not limited to, presentations, skits, song, poetry, dance, or stepping, strolling, and saluting.

1. No performance will involve the degradation and /or the belittlement of any other organization including fraternities and sororities.
2. No performance which takes the form of dancing, saluting, singing and/or skits should be performed using lewd, indecent or obscene behavior and language.
3. All “props” used in any performance must be approved, at least one week prior to the event by the Office of Student Development. No props shall be used in conflict with University policy.
4. Those organizations or individuals that are not officially recognized by Stockton University cannot perform at any Stockton University event without the sponsorship of a Stockton University recognized organization and/or written permission from The Office of Student Development. Written permission can only be obtained by submitting the following within one week of the date of the performance:
 - The name of the University recognized sponsor organization
 - The name of the organization performing
 - The contact information of the Guest organization wishing to perform on campus
 - The name of the University or University where that organization is recognized along with the contact information of that staff member who oversees fraternities and sororities
 - All individuals that will be perform at the Stockton University show

Those organizations that do not follow the above process to receive permission will be asked to cease their performance immediately and will be asked to leave the University at said time. The Office of Student Development will then alert the appropriate University authorities and their Inter/National Headquarters about the violation of University policies. The organization that sponsors said performance or event will then be held accountable for the actions or behaviors of those organizations they both officially sponsor and those who have not followed this guideline.
