# **Biography**

As a Sister of Mercy, Deirdre served as Director of the Mercy Global Concern (MGC) at the United Nations for over ten years. From September 2012 to April 2014 she served as the Executive Director of the Partnership for Global Justice at the UN, responsible for providing access to UN events for over 125 small congregations who did not have the resources for a full-time representative at the UN. Since May 2014 she has worked with UNICEF, the body at the UN focusing on children's and girls' education. She is one the founding members of the NGO *The Mercy Girl Effect*.

Deirdre's international experience includes raising significant monies in the USA, the Republic and the North of Ireland, the USA and the United Kingdom to build and support schools (fourteen, at the last count) in Cambodia, working in conjunction with Denise Coughlan, RSM, a Sister of Mercy from Australia who heads up Jesuit Refugee Services in Cambodia); raising money and working with Angela Hartigan, RSM, from Kenya to support various educational and social service projects in the Mukuru slum in Nairobi; securing computers to support the work of the Sisters of Mercy in Guyana South America, working specifically with Sister Noel Mendes; contributing towards the building of a school in Nuba, Sudan, and rebuilding it after it was bombed, working with Sister Cathy Solano; working with Sister Celestine Daly to build a school in Zambia; working with the Sisters of Mercy in the Philippines to refurbish a hospital; working with the Sisters of Mercy in Nigeria to build 112 small mud-houses for families displaced by Boko Haram; and helping to build a small school in Sugu, Nigeria, working with Sister Agnes Hannon, RSM.

During her time as the Director of the Mercy Office at the UN, Deirdre did significant fund-raising and offered 25-30 all expenses paid opportunities for Sisters of Mercy around the world to attend a two-week conference at the United Nations entitled: Bridging the Gap. Over 200 Mercy Sisters took part in these conferences held over 8 years.

She also served on the Executive Committee of the NGO-United Nations annual conference and was responsible for the mapping and strategic plan of the conference.

Growing up in Northern Ireland, she witnessed the Irish Troubles and saw how young minds can become sectionalized and dehumanized. This led her, in 1998, to coordinate *The Dance of Co-existence* project, which brought together teenagers from "both parts of the divide" (Protestant and Catholic) to look at each other's history and culture and to express their differences and understandings in dance. This group of young people was invited to perform in Dublin for the President of Ireland and representatives from all second-level schools in Ireland.

She has been a visiting professor of Social Sciences at Mount Aloysius College, PA, and has served as the Director of Mercy Global Concern (MGC) at the United Nations, the Mercy NGO representing the worldwide Sisters of Mercy. Currently she is the consultant adviser to UNICEF on their initiative "Partnering Religious Congregations with UNICEF".
