ABOUT STOCKTON



Founded in 1969, Stockton University has grown nearly tenfold since opening its doors in the fall of 1971 with a class of 1,000 students at the old Mayflower Hotel in Atlantic City. Today, nearly 9,000 students attend classes on the 1,600-acre Galloway campus in the Pinelands National Reserve and at Stockton University Atlantic City, just steps from the beach and Boardwalk.

Under newly appointed President Joe Bertolino, Stockton enters an era that retains its commitment to student-focused interdisciplinary undergraduate liberal arts education while expanding programs to meet the demands of the 21st century workforce. Undergraduates can choose from more than 160 areas of study, including Africana Studies, Cannabis Studies, Criminal Justice, Education, Environmental Science, Hospitality, Tourism and Event Management, Nursing and Sustainability. Stockton also offers 17 master's degree programs and three doctoral programs in Physical Therapy, Nursing Practice and Organizational Leadership.

Stockton is ranked among the Top 100 Public National Universities, according to the 2024 U.S. News & World Report College Rankings. Military Times ranks Stockton among its "Best for Vets" colleges. Stockton also is very transfer friendly and partners with area community colleges to offer a seamless transition to a bachelor's degree.

As enrollment has grown, so has the University. A new academic quad has transformed the Galloway campus, anchored by the Campus Center, Unified Science Center I & II, and the John F. Scarpa Health Sciences Center. Stockton also expanded its presence throughout South Jersey, with instructional sites in Manahawkin, Woodbine and Hammonton.

Stockton Atlantic City, which opened in the fall of 2018, spurred the development of a University District, bringing new excitement and economic diversity to the resort community. A second residential building opened in the fall of 2023, bringing the number of students living in the city to more than 900. Students actively live and learn in Atlantic City, engaging with businesses and the community through internships and community service projects.

PUBLIC EVENTS







The Hughes Center sponsors in-person and virtual speaker series, forums, and panel discussions that engage New Jersey residents on public policy.

Hughes Center Conversations

This series includes an annual in-person event featuring a prominent guest speaker. The aim is to foster community engagement by providing a forum for the discussion of important issues that impact their lives. Previous speakers include U.S. Supreme Court Justice Neil Gorsuch, Peter Baker, Chief White House Correspondent for *The New York Times*, and Rear Admiral Kevin Sweeny, USN (Ret.), former chief of staff to U.S. Defense Secretary James Mattis.

Policy Panels, Forums, and Conferences

These events feature expert commentary on timely policy topics. Throughout the year, the center regularly hosts panel discussions, spotlights on faculty research, and virtual forums that tackle the most pressing issues for New Jerseyans. Our panels often include a mix of public and private sector experts, researchers, advocates, and practitioners speaking about issues like judicial safety - featuring Judge Esther Salas, or New Jersey's energy future - featuring the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities President Christine Guhl-Sadovy, alongside industry and business leaders. Our inaugural conference this year on the power of public higher education in New Jersey brought together university presidents, business leaders, and alumni, and legislators from across the state.

Constitution Day

The Hughes Center for Public Policy hosts this annual campus-wide event that features keynote presentations by legal scholars, journalists, or practitioners focused on constitutional issues, hosting experts like Mary McCord, Rick Hasen, and Bryan Stevenson. In addition to the Constitution Day planning committee led by university faculty and staff, Stockton students serve as Constitution Day fellows, allowing them the chance to engage directly with renowned experts.

STOCKTON POLLING INSTITUTE



The Stockton Polling Institute conducts independent nonpartisan public opinion polling on issues of importance across New Jersey and the region. The Hughes Center for Public Policy established the Stockton Polling Institute in 2012 in part to give voice to the citizens of southern New Jersey. Managed by Alyssa Maurice, our Assistant Director and Head of Research & Polling, our public opinion research follows American Association for Public Opinion Research (AAPOR)'s transparency standards and uses new technologies to ensure reliable and valid results.

The Stockton Polling Institute conducts polls as a public service, and to assist our faculty and administration in research. The Hughes Center recognizes that understanding the will of the people is critical to the policymaking process. With a focus on salient and timely policy issues, the Polling Institute ensures that New Jerseyans have a seat at the table. The Hughes Center supplements its public opinion research with educational programming to provide residents with crucial context to develop informed positions.

RESEARCH



The Hughes Center for Public Policy conducts relevant and timely research on important policy issues by supporting our expert faculty at Stockton University.

Public Policy Research Fellows

Each year the Hughes Center sponsors Faculty Fellows who conduct research on behalf of and in collaboration with the Center. Stockton faculty explore timely issues relevant to their field of expertise to inform and educate both the public and policymakers alike. The research areas recently examined by Hughes Center Fellows include innovative therapies for mental health treatment, civic education in K-12 schools, public opinion and immigration, and maternal health outcomes. The Hughes Center aims to enhance the impact and reach of this work by organizing supplemental programming to highlight their findings, including panel events, digital content, data dashboards, research showcases, and more.

Public Policy Research Funding

The Center offers a competitive funding opportunity to support faculty research projects.

The South Jersey Economic Review (SJER)

These reports are published bi-annually by the Hughes Center for Public Policy. Written by Associate Professor Oliver Cooke, Ph.D., the SJER provides in-depth analyses of the regional economy's health care, construction, retail trade, and gaming industries. It also explores key trends in the region's labor force, demographics and wages.

Student Research Support

The Hughes Center also supports and serves as a resource for student researchers at Stockton, providing consultation on research design, including methodology, questionnaire development and guidance on industry standards, assisting with data collection, providing data files for them to engage in their own analysis as part of their academic coursework, financial support for projects, guest lectures on practical research applications, and more.

WASHINGTON INTERNSHIP PROGRAM









Stockton University, in partnership with The Washington Center (TWC), offers a one-of-a-kind Washington Internship Program (WIP) that allows students to spend a full semester living and working in Washington, D.C at the heart of national and global decision-making. Students of all majors can earn academic credit, gain real-world experience, and build a professional network that will last a lifetime. In addition to interning with top-tier organizations in government, nonprofits, media, law and business, students participate in career readiness programming, including workshops, networking events, and speaker series with thought leaders.

The Hughes Public Policy Center is proud to run this program, engaging in student recruitment, administrative support, academic and career advising for interested students, and providing financial support to Stockton interns while in D.C.

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT



Internship Support and Professional Development

The center helps connect students to local legislative, government affairs, and policy internships. In addition, we provide workforce development like resume review, interview preparation, and mentorship.

Student Competitions and Events

The center provides opportunities for students to participate in national competitions like the NATO Disinformation Challenge hosted by the William and Mary College and NATO Headquarters and to receive invaluable coaching from industry experts.

Pizza and Politics Series

The center hosts regular watch parties for webinars by the Council on Foreign Relations that address timely geopolitical issues. This series also includes "Lunch with a Legislator", monthly sessions hosted in partnership with Stockton's Office of Government Relations. Legislators at the state and national level come to campus to talk to students about their role and how they got there. The students get to engage directly with renowned experts and policymakers through this series.

Financial Support for Student Opportunities

The center funds student attendance to the annual NEW Leadership Program at Rutgers University, a national, nonpartisan public leadership training program for college students, addressing women's underrepresentation in politics.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT AND EDUCATION



Election Debates and Candidate Forums

The Hughes Center for Public Policy sponsors election debates for candidates for federal, state, and local offices. Election debates and public forums are vital to a healthy democracy. They help connect voters to candidates, boost political awareness and civic engagement, and help anchor the public discourse in substantive policy exchange. Debates are held at the main Galloway campus and in Atlantic City. We adhere to the guidelines of the Federal Election Commission (FEC) and, when applicable, New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) rules for live debates and candidate forums, ensuring equal treatment of all candidates and parties.

American Democracy Project (ADP)

The American Democracy Project is an initiative of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU). At Stockton, the Hughes Center for Public Policy plans and promotes ADP programming focused on fostering civic education and engagement. Throughout the academic year, ADP develops programs on a range of different timely political and policy issues that are designed to increase political awareness and engagement for our campus community.

"Ospreys Talk" Dialogue Series

In 2026, the Center will reestablish campus workshops and training in deliberative dialogue for students, faculty, and staff through a new series called "Ospreys Talk". The Center is proud to facilitate the participation of the university in a one-year program offered by the American Association of Colleges and Universities (AAC&U) and Constructive Dialogue Institute (CDI).

THE AMBASSADOR WILLIAM J. HUGHES COLLECTION



The late Ambassador Hughes donated his personal archive, which chronicles his years of public service in the House of Representatives and as the U.S. Ambassador to Panama. The archive includes correspondence, photos, diaries, Congressional Record citations, press releases, newsletters and press clippings, all of which is available in the Stockton Library for use by researchers.

Bill signing letters and pens from Presidents Ronald Reagan and Bill Clinton, photos of Amb. Hughes with various presidents, resolutions, plaques, photos and other items documenting his distinguished years of public service all are on display at the Hughes Center on the Galloway campus (L-Wing, 2nd floor).

AMBASSADOR WILLIAM J. HUGHES (1932-2019)

A native of southern New Jersey, Ambassador William H. Hughes was dedicated to the prosperity and freedom of the American people. He and his wife Nancy were married for 61 years and raised their four children in Ocean City, N.J.

Prior to his election to Congress in 1974, he was president of the law firm of Loveland, Hughes and Garrett in Ocean City. He then served for 10 years as First Assistant Prosecutor in Cape May County and established a record of never being reversed on appeal.

Throughout his career, Bill Hughes sponsored projects and initiatives to create jobs, protect the environment and improve the quality of life in southern New Jersey. Serving in the U.S. House of Representatives for two decades and under five presidents, he was a prominent leader as Chairman of the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Crime, House Aging Subcommittee on Retirement Income and Employment, and later the Judiciary Subcommittee on Intellectual Property and Judicial Administration.

As Congressman, Bill Hughes sponsored legislation to prohibit ocean dumping, protect our beaches, and enhance the region's tourism industry. He co-authored the historic legislation that established New Jersey Pinelands National Reserve and spearheaded the efforts that led to the National Wild and Scenic Rivers designation of the Manumuskin and Menantico rivers.

Bill co-founded the South Jersey Economic Development District and won approval for a program that established the nation's premiere aviation test and evaluation facility in South Jersey, which was later renamed the William J. Hughes Federal Aviation Technical Center. He helped develop a new port in Salem that was designated a U.S. port of entry and helped establish the first Foreign Trade Zone in South Jersey.

During his tenure as Chairman of the House Judiciary Subcommittee on Crime, Congress passed more than 40 major anticrime laws dealing with drug trafficking, child pornography, money laundering, computer crime and the banning of cop-killer bullets.

Bill was appointed U.S. Ambassador to Panama by former President Bill Clinton in 1995. One of his proudest accomplishments was participating in the return of the Panama Canal to Panamanian control.

The Hughes Center Honors recognizes outstanding New Jerseyans for excellence in their field and for a commitment to public service, civility, and bipartisanship that reflects the life and career of Ambassador William J. Hughes. Past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients include John Scarpa, the late former New Jersey Governors Brendan Byrne and Jim Florio, former Governors Thomas Kean and Christine Todd Whitman, and the late Ambassador Hughes, who was presented his award in 2017 by then-former Vice President Joe Biden.

Civility in Politics and Government Award Distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award

These awards recognize distinguished individuals whose careers reflect extraordinary public service, visionary leadership, and a legacy of integrity in civic life.

Dr. Salmon was a Hall of Fame Educator, Coach, and K-12 Administrator. Dr. Salmon and his wife Marilyn together were educators in the Millville Public Schools for 52 years and taught over 7,000 students who are now 44 to 78 years old.

26 years in Government

Dr. Salmon received numerous awards and honors as the Mayor of Millville, Cumberland County Freeholder Director, New Jersey State Assemblyman, President of the N.J. Board of Public Utilities, and a member of Governor Florio's Cabinet.

27 years in Business and Industry

Dr. Salmon was the founder and president of four successful companies working throughout New Jersey and America: AUS Pathways; Salmon Ventures Ltd.; New Jersey Energy Coalition; and Living Legacy.

Dr. Salmon was an elected leader and convention speaker for the National Association of Regulatory Commissioners (NARUC) from 1991 to 2023. Dr. Salmon and his wife Marilyn attended over 200 conferences held in all the major cities in the United States of America.

Dr. Salmon's decades of work in government, energy policy, and civic engagement exemplify both the spirit and substance of both awards. Dr. Salmon was the driving force behind the creation of the Hughes Center. His selfless dedication to public service, his advocacy for the energy and utility resources of the state of New Jersey, and his contribution to education deserve this recognition. Dr. Salmon has been a 'giver' his entire life to his family, his community, and New Jersey at large. From his early service in the New Jersey General Assembly - where he earned respect across the aisle for your practical leadership and statesmanship - to his appointment as President of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, he has consistently placed the public interest above partisanship. His focus on long-term solutions, particularly in energy infrastructure, economic development, and regulatory reform, has left an enduring impact on the state and its future. As Chairman of Salmon Ventures Ltd., Dr. Salmon continued to guide municipalities and public agencies with wisdom and clarity, earning a reputation as a trusted voice in public policy. Equally important has been his unwavering commitment to civil discourse. In a time when public trust in institutions and leaders is often tested, Dr. Salmon has modeled humility, collegiality, and respect for democratic values - hallmarks of the civility Congressman William J. Hughes stood for. His career is a testament to what leadership in public life should be: honest, principled, and committed to making government work for all. We are honored to celebrate his lifetime of contributions and his continuing influence in New Jersey's civic and political landscape.

Community Leadership Award

Cassie Iacovelli
Former Executive Director, MainStreet Hammonton

Cassie Iacovelli served as the Executive Director of MainStreet Hammonton for 15 years and retired in July 2023. During her tenure, community bonds were strengthened, significant economic vitality expanded in Downtown Hammonton and Hammonton became a destination for arts, events, shopping, dining and craft beverages; leading Hammonton to be honored as one of the "Great Places in New Jersey" by

the American Planning Association. Cassie also served on the Hammonton Arts Advisory Committee, Hammonton Health Coalition, Hammonton Covid Relief Economic Impact Committee and Hammonton Pedestrian & Bike Steering Committee. In 2022, she was proudly honored as an "Inclusion Pathfinder" by Allies in Caring, a local non-profit, for her contribution to Equality, Diversity and Inclusion.

Hammonton was one of six South Jersey towns selected to receive a \$100,000 grant from the Community Foundation of South Jersey (CFSJ); aimed to strengthen relationships and encourage a sense of solidarity in South Jersey communities. For five years, Cassie served as the Program Coordinator initiating the Community Heart and Soul model. This community-wide and resident driven engagement and planning process generated the data needed to develop Community Value Statements that reflected what matters most to the Hammonton community and the development of a Community Plan of Action to enhance Hammonton now and in the future. The final phase of this project was the creation of a Hammonton Community Endowment, made possible through a challenge grant in partnership with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Cassie now serves on the Hammonton Community Endowment Advisory Board tasked with building on the momentum of Hammonton Heart and Soul's process and fostering endowment building to provide community grants to ensure Hammonton remains a strong, healthy and vibrant community.

Prior to her position in Hammonton, Cassie was employed at Rider University from 1980-2008. Her final position was Assistant Dean of Campus Life. Upon her retirement from Rider University, a Cassie D Iacovelli Endowed Scholarship was established and is now awarded annually to a sophomore or junior student leader who is in good academic standing. The Cassie D Iacovelli Student Government Award is given each year to a full-time undergraduate student in good academic standing who serves in student government. Cassie holds a Master of Education in Student Personnel Services from The College of New Jersey and Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Seton Hall University. Cassie has lived in Hammonton with her husband John since 2008. They are the proud parents of a son John, his wife Bertha, their daughter Joanna and daughter Nicole and her husband Jack Meyers. John and Cassie cherish being grandparents to four grandsons, Isaac, Jake, Ethan and Pete and a granddaughter, Catherine.
