

Fall 2007 Enrollment Report* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

TOTAL ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Total headcount for fall 2007 is 7,355, representing an increase of 142 students over last fall's total headcount of 7,213. Total FTE increased by approximately 2.0% to 6,276.

NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

- ◆ With regard to new undergraduates (freshmen and transfer/re-admits) in fall 2007:
 - There are 799 new freshmen and 1,088 transfer/re-admits. This represents an overall decrease of 44 new undergraduate students compared to fall 2006.
 - The total SAT for first-time regularly admitted freshmen is 1105 and the average high school rank is the 74th percentile.
 - The Honors Program has 40 new freshman participants, which has positive ramifications for future recruitment efforts.
 - There are 211 new graduate students enrolled: 44 of these are enrolled in Stockton's new doctoral program in Physical Therapy.

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Third-semester retention rates for first-time full-time freshmen remained strong at 83%.
- ◆ Undergraduate FTE increased by 87 to 5,972, while the actual headcount of undergraduate students increased by 39 to 6,766, as compared to last fall.
- ◆ Females constitute 59% of the total undergraduate class; 41% are male. These percentages are consistent with previous years and with national trends.
- ◆ The 6-year graduation rate has increased by 3% to 67%.

GRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Graduate and post-baccalaureate FTE increased by 11% over fall 2006 to a record of 304.
- ◆ Headcount increased by 103 students to a record number of 589 students.
