## Fall 2009 Enrollment Report\* SUMMARY STATEMENTS

### TOTAL ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Total headcount for fall 2009 is 7,559 representing an increase of 252 students over last fall's total headcount of 7,307. Total FTE increased by approximately 379 to 6701.

### NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT

- ◆ With regard to new undergraduates (freshmen and transfer/re-admits) in fall 2009:
  - There are 870 new freshmen and 1105 transfer/re-admits. This represents an increase of 28 freshman an increase of 148 transfer/re-admits for an overall increase of 176 new undergraduate students.
  - The total SAT for first-time regularly admitted freshmen is 1143 and the average high school rank is the 81st percentile.
  - The Honors Program has 41 new freshman participants, which has positive ramifications for future recruitment efforts.
- ◆ There are 275 new graduate students enrolled: 126 new matriculated graduate students are enrolled in a program sponsored by the School of Education. 15 new students enrolled in the State's first Professional Science Master's in Environmental Science Program.

### UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Undergraduate FTE increased by 305 to 6281, while the actual headcount of undergraduate students increased by 146 to 6813, as compared to last fall.
- ◆ Females constitute 57% of the total undergraduate class; 43% are male. These percentages are consistent with previous years and with national trends.

### GRADUATE ENROLLMENT

- ◆ Graduate and post-baccalaureate FTE increased by 74 over fall 2008 to a record of 420.
- ◆ Headcount increased by 106 students to a record number of 746 students.
