The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey Fall 2000 Enrollment Report

Summary Statements

- ♦ The college's enrollment management program has been successful in attracting a quality applicant pool from which to recruit new students.
- ♦ The total number of new freshmen increased by 3%, to 755. In addition, 750 new transfers, 71 readmits, and 84 new graduate students enrolled.
- ◆ Total SAT scores for regularly admitted freshmen increased by 8 points and remain more than 100 points higher than New Jersey and National averages for collegebound students.
- ♦ The undergraduate headcount of 5,976 is consistent with last year's figure, The full-time equivalent (FTE) has increased by 2% to 5,084.
- ♦ The average credit load per undergraduate students has increased to 13.6 credits, a new record, as is the credit load of 7.5 for graduate students.
- ♦ A record 82% of all undergraduates are full-time.
- ♦ The combined headcount for graduate and undergraduate students has reached 6,312, a new record. Combined FTE is 5,295, a 2% increase over last year's figure.
- ♦ ARHU and SOBL both experienced a 1% increase in declared and intended majors.
- ◆ The third semester retention rate for new freshmen remains strong, at 83%.
- ♦ The 6 year graduation rate for the 1994 cohort is 62%, and marks a consistent 2 to 3 percent increase over the past few years.
- ♦ A record I,512 degrees were granted for FY00. A record I,456 undergraduate, and a 56 graduate degrees were awarded.
- ♦ Instructional technology continues to attract the largest number of graduate students, while 45% of graduate FTE is generated by the physical therapy program.
