

- SUMMARY STATEMENTS -

Spring 1999 New Students

- **Undergraduate:** The 466 new students who registered this semester include 27 first-time freshmen, 367 transfers, and 72 readmitted students.
- **Graduate:** There were a total of 30 first-time graduate students representing 4 of Stockton's 5 master's programs.

Spring 1999 Headcount and FTE

- **Total Population:** The combined Spring 1999 undergraduate and graduate headcount (HDCT) is a record 5965, exceeding last year's total of 5909 by 56 (or 1%). The corresponding full-time equivalent (FTE), also a record, is 4916, and exceeds last year's figure by 68 (or 1%).
- **Undergraduate:** As Stockton continues to decrease the number of non-matriculated students, the final undergraduate headcount for Spring 1999 is 5691, which is 38 less than last year's total. A larger average credit load per student however, has resulted in an increase in FTE, for a new record of 4776.
- **Graduate:** This spring's total includes students representing five master's programs. A total of 274 students generated 140 FTE. This represents more than a 50% increase in headcount, and an 87% increase in FTE.

1998-99 Annualized Headcount and FTE

- **Total Population:** The combined annualized headcount of 6063 students is slightly higher than last year's record 6058. FTE generated was a record 4983, which exceeds last year's figure of 4965.
- **Undergraduate:** Annualized headcount for undergraduate students is 5795, generating 4850 FTE.
- **Graduate:** Since last year's benchmark figures, the annualized headcount for graduate students is up 55%, to 268. The corresponding FTE is 133, an 83% one-year increase.

Annualized data are determined by averaging fall and spring headcount and FTE figures.
