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Annual Report 2019-2020

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We are proud to present you with the 2019-20 annual report for Stockton University at Manahawkin. We have had many great achievements this year as we continue to grow our nursing program offerings and academic advising services for health sciences students. We increased our nursing courses by approximately eight percent offering a total of 29 classes. We offered a new global perspectives course titled Introduction to Global Studies that was fully enrolled and was very well received by students. We partnered with the Manahawkin Nursing Club to offer career panel discussions, a welcome reception for new nursing students and supported a personal hygiene collection drive for the community. Items collected were donated to families located in Ocean County during the Covid-19 stay at home order.

In response to all courses being shifted to online instruction in March, we moved and scheduled co-curricular programming to virtual Zoom presentations. We had an excellent attendance averaging 50 participants per program reaching a total of 300 attendees. The presenters were Stockton faculty, staff, and students, as well as community members. The topics included Recycling 101, Crabbing at Barnegat Bay, Liberators of the Holocaust, Making your Home a Healing Environment, Staying Civically Engaged at Home, and Exploring the LBI Region.

We continued to foster many collaborative community partnerships throughout Ocean County that provided student volunteer opportunities, workshops, trainings, educational programs and increase our presence in the community. We collaborated with Southern Ocean County Chamber of Commerce (SOCCC) to offer workshops for Non-Profit organizations throughout the year. Bi-annually we hosted the Ocean County Prosecutors Office Crisis Intervention Training. Moreover, the Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) program continues to enjoy consistent participation by community members for educational, creative and socially engaging programs.

We expanded opportunities for student engagement, programming and participation in Ocean County. We hope that you find this report to be informative and invite you attend one of our programs.

Engagement



Students in Manahawkin develop partnerships with local nonprofit and for-profit agencies through service-learning programs. Our faculty and staff offer educational workshops and conduct research for our local businesses and the Southern Ocean Chamber of Commerce. Students, faculty and staff participate in presenting educational programs that enrich the lives of Stockton and community participants.

Global Perspectives



We offer a multitude of educational, cultural and historical workshops that examine international and comprehensive points of view. Topics include; documentary photography, Santiago de Chile, Bystanders, Holocaust and genocide. Our faculty possess rich educational and cultural backgrounds offering students a global perspective.

Sustainability



Our natural science and mathematics courses routinely participate in environmentally oriented community service projects. Students work with regional and statewide conservancy groups and programs. We actively participate in recycling initiatives on site and in the community and offered a Recycling 101 workshop.

Bystanders Lecture

Steven Marcus presented a lecture which discussed the role of a bystander during the Holocaust and the most genocidal acts from the beginning of the 20th century through today, including the lack of involvement of ordinary citizens on all sides.

Art Around The World

Dr. Arnaldo Cordero-Roman presented a lecture on the constant interplay between public art, such as graffiti, and global urban development. He selected images which fuse the social, cultural, historical and graphic depictions.



Food For Thought

Anthony Dissen, MPH, MA, RDN presented several programs throughout the year (including a few online). "Culinary Medicine" informed on how to prepare your food to increase the overall benefits and enhance nutritional quality and medicinal effects. Dissen also presented, "Understanding Diabetes: Moving Beyond Carbohydrates," which taught about the dietary and lifestyle factors that lead to Type 2 diabetes, and what you can do to protect yourself.

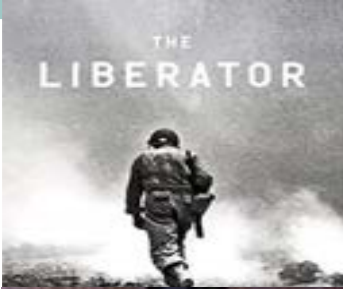
Crabbing at Barnegat Bay

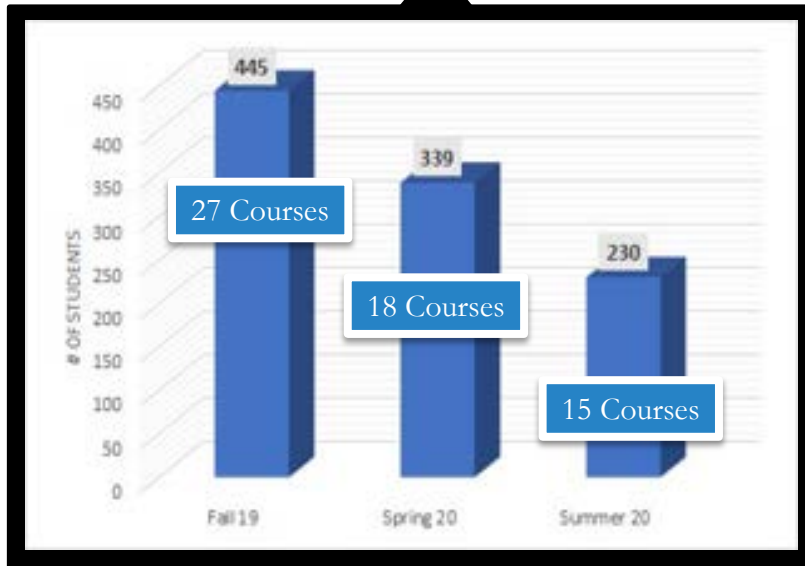
Liberators of the Holocaust

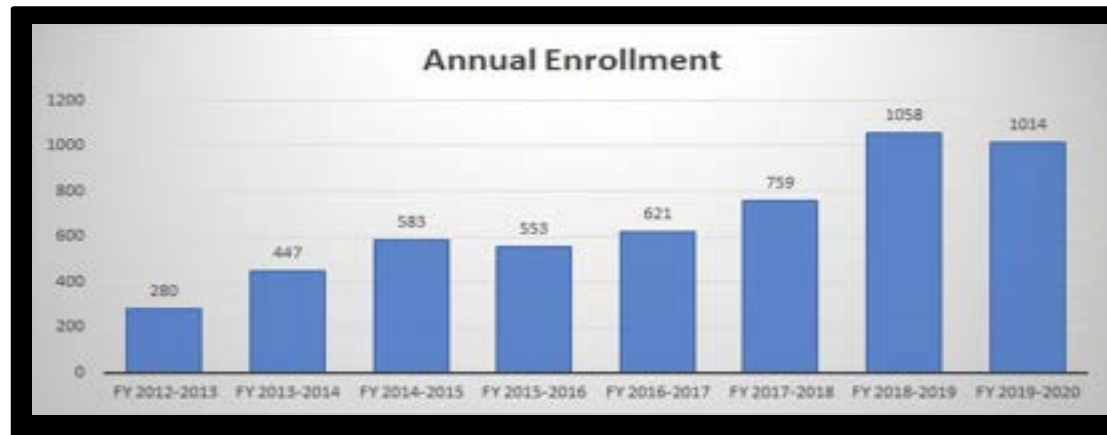
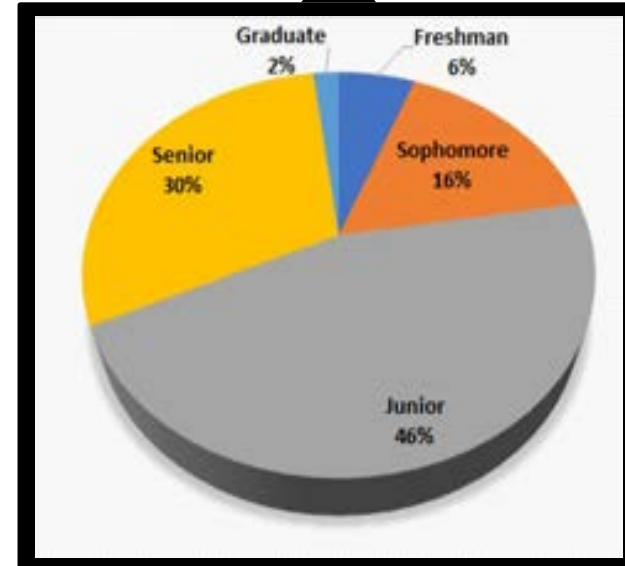


Enrollment 2019-2020

1,014 students enrolled in 60 courses

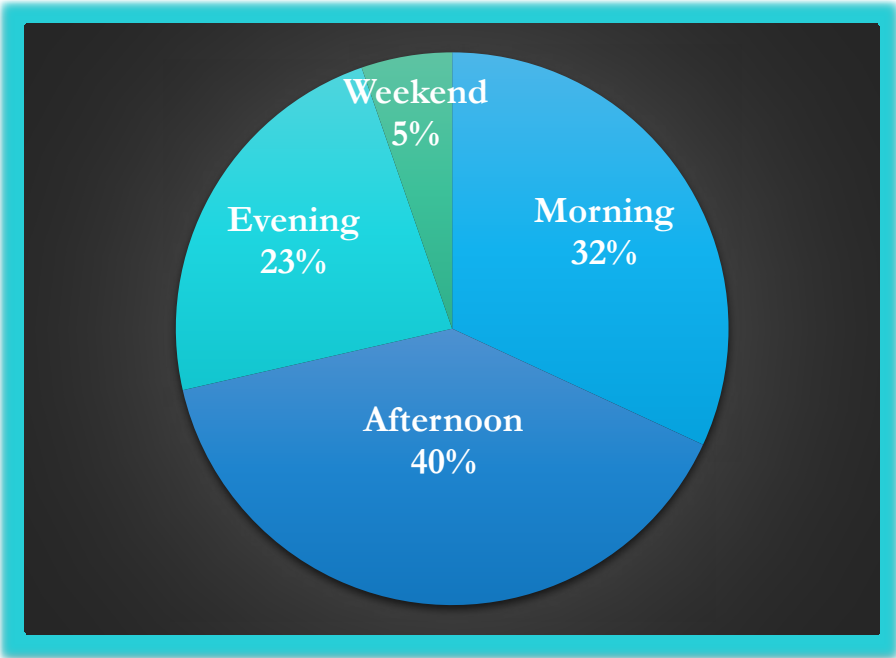


Enrollment by Grade Level

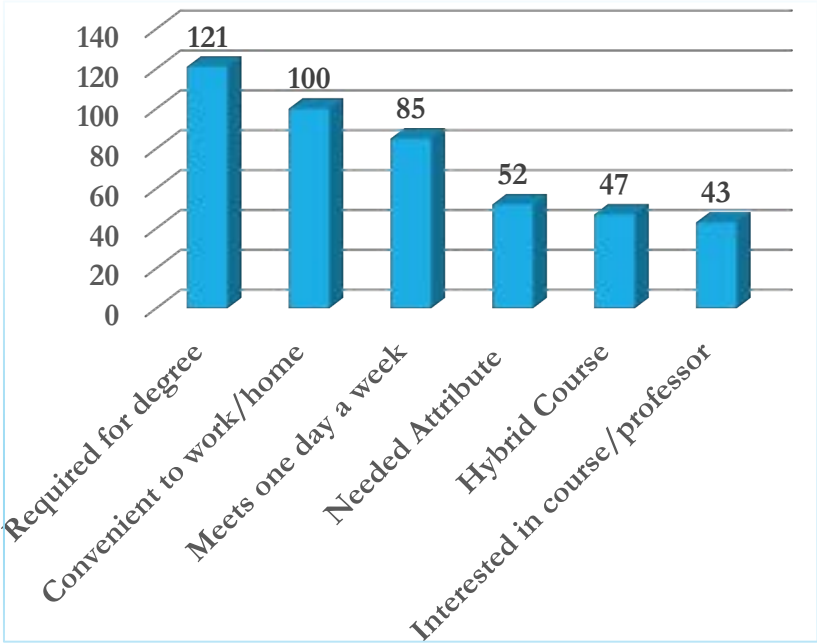


During the fall 2019 semester a total of 206 students took the Stockton at Manahawkin survey. The following data represents their responses.

When are you most interested in taking classes?

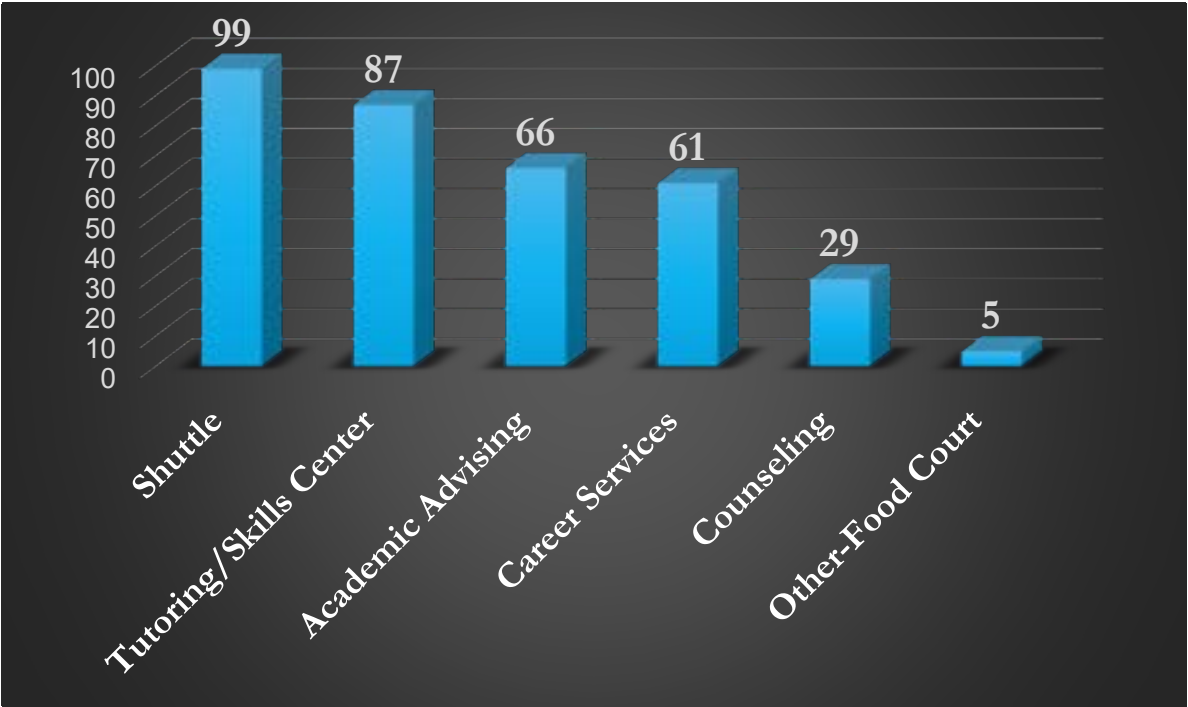


Why did you enroll in a course at the Manahawkin Site?
