Director's Message



This was a landmark year for Manahawkin, as we proudly unveiled the new hybrid RN to BSN program and marked our expansion into the Health Sciences! We are now delighted to be the home of two Stockton Nursing programs. In December, we celebrated the graduation of Stockton's first Accelerated Nursing cohort, which began in fall of 2016. In the summer session, we were able to offer our first graduate nursing course to meet the high demands from the health science growth in the region.

In collaboration with the School of Health Sciences, Facilities, Information Technology, and the Plant Management teams, our staff participated in the creative planning, design and execution of the new 7,915 square-foot expanded space adjacent to our original office. The new educational complex contains two state-of-the-art nursing labs, a 48 seat smart classroom, a conference room, and a student lounge area. To create a cultured and aesthetically appealing environment, we collaborated with the Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University to have artwork displayed throughout the new location. The expansion opened in January of 2018, and the lounge area has quickly become a haven for students to study, utilize computers, enjoy a meal, and socialize with one another. On March 8, 2018 we held a ribbon cutting ceremony to dedicate the new facility.

We are pleased that both enrollment and course offerings have been at an all-time high, with 759 registrations in 48 health science and general studies course offerings. We continue to partner and collaborate with many organizations and businesses throughout Ocean County, and I had the honor to have been appointed to serve on the Southern Ocean County Chamber Commerce Board of Directors in January of 2018. We look forward to continue to broaden our footprint in Ocean County by offering expanded academic and co-curricular programming to both students and the community. We invite you to learn more by reading about our highlights and growth in this annual report.

Learning

Students are able to enroll in a variety of general studies and program courses that are hybrid and module-free.

Students also have the opportunity to take courses with a service-learning attribute. Our Manahawkin location is home to Stockton's Accelerated Nursing Program and the Hybrid RN to BSN program and offer many core courses in the Bachelor of Science in Health Science program.



Engagement

Students in Manahawkin foster partnerships with local nonprofit and for-profit agencies by participating in volunteer and service-learning programs. Our faculty and staff provide educational workshops and conduct research for our local businesses and Chamber of commerce. Students, faculty and staff participate in offering educational programs that enrich the lives of the community participants.



Global Perspectives

We offer a multitude of educational, cultural and historical workshops that examine international and comprehensive points of view. Topics include, human security, genocide, and diversity in the workforce. Our faculty possess rich educational and cultural backgrounds, which allows them to provide students with a global perspective.



Sustainability

Our natural science and mathematics courses routinely participate in environmentally oriented community service projects.

Students work with conservancy groups such as Project Terrapin, Alliance for a Living Ocean, the Marine Mammal Stranding Center, as well as government agencies including the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife and the Department of Environmental Protection.

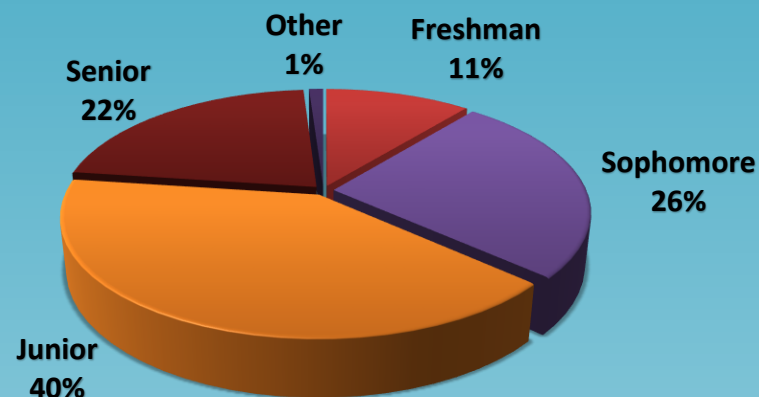
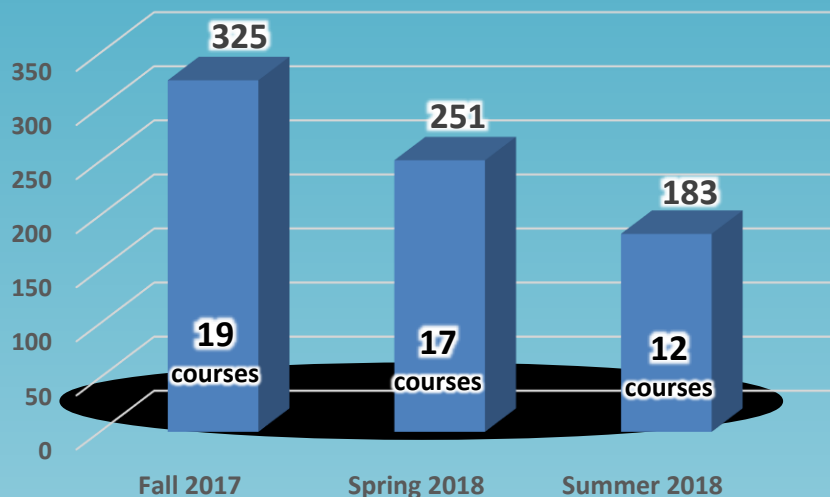

Enrollment 2017-2018

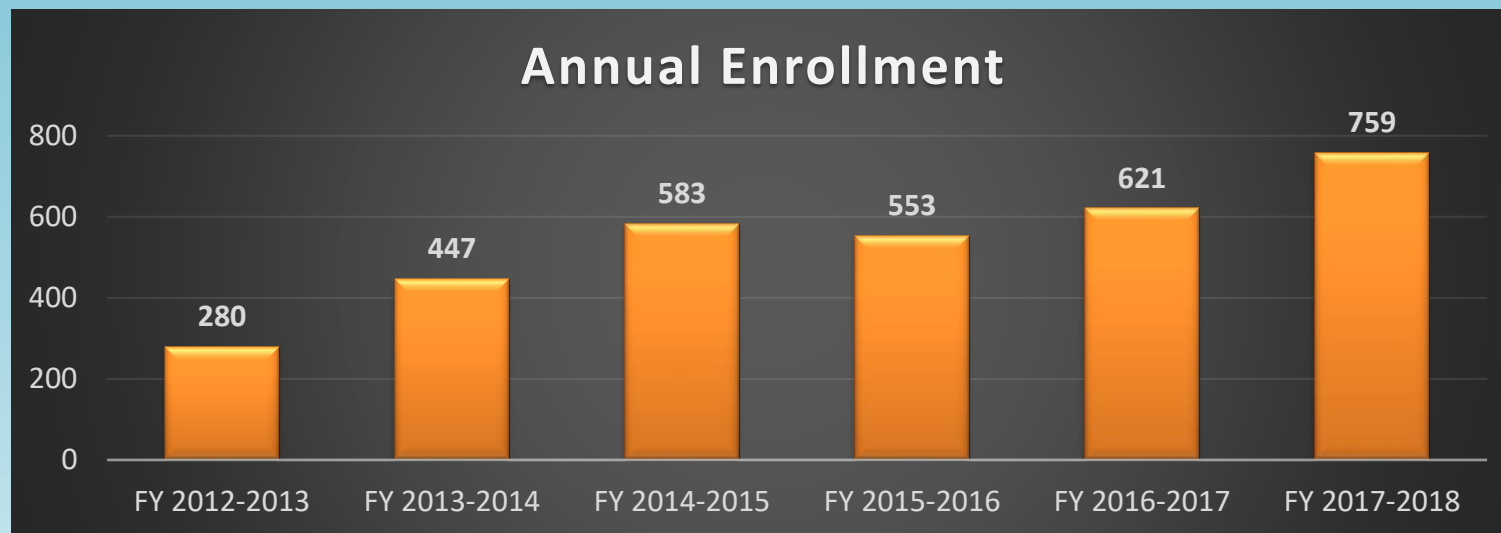

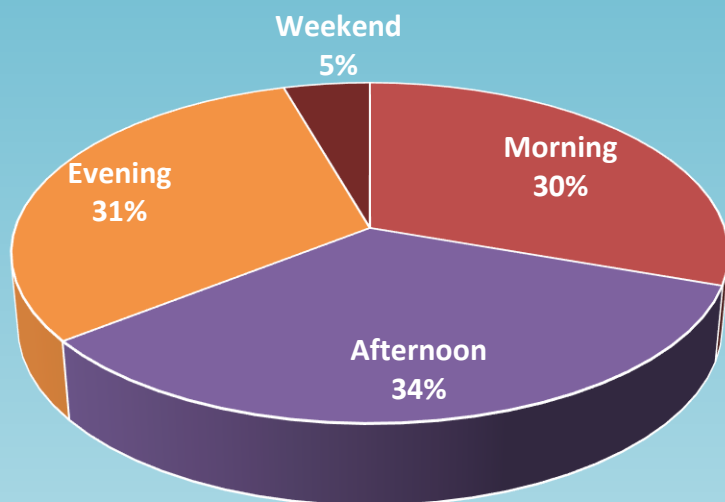

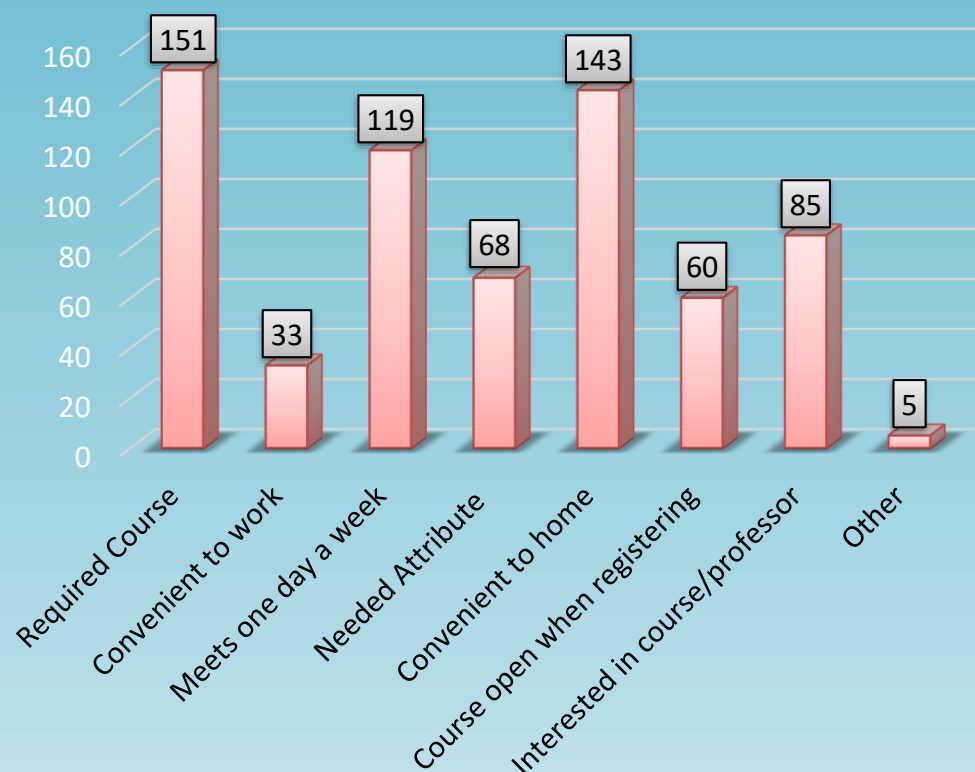


During the fall 2017 and spring 2018 semesters a total of 300 students took the Stockton at Manahawkin survey. The following data represents their responses.

When are you most interested in taking classes?

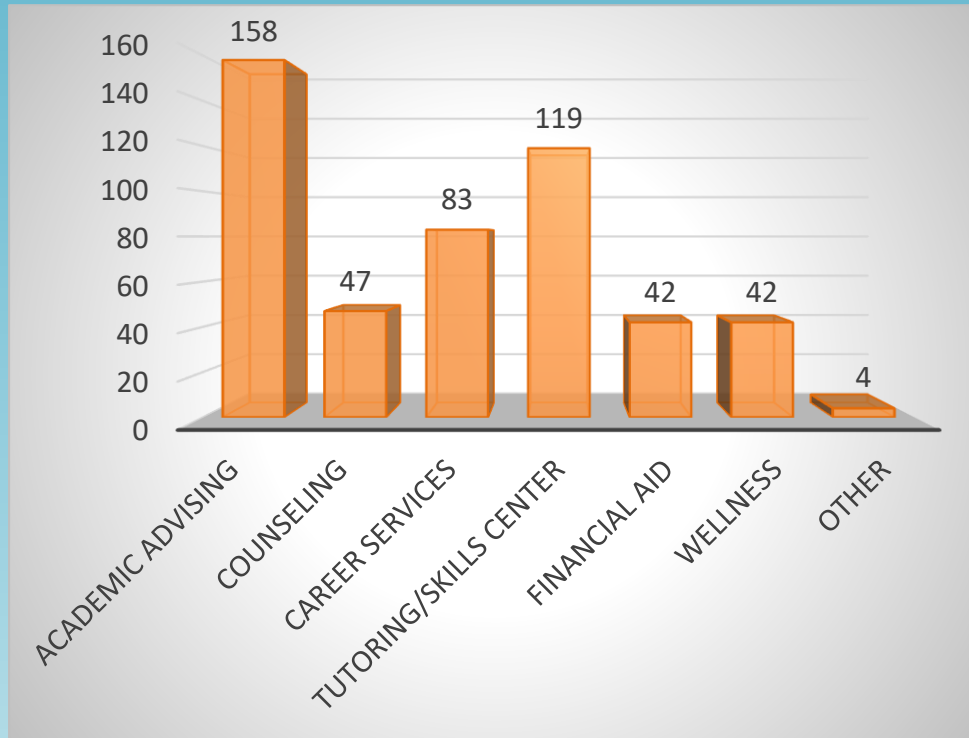


Why did you enroll in a course at the Manahawkin Site?
