

Director's Message

We are proud to present you with the 2018-19 annual report for Stockton University at Manahawkin. We have had many great achievements this year as we continue to grow our nursing programs and expand our footprint in Ocean County. The Manahawkin site increased enrollment from 759 registrants in FY 2017-2018 to 1,058 registrants in FY 2018-19, an increase of nearly forty percent! We continue to exceed expectations in the number of course offerings as well. We increased our offerings in Graduate Nursing courses and look forward to working with the School of Health Sciences to continue expanding academic programs.

We have numerous community partners throughout Ocean County that we collaborated with to offer student volunteer hours, workshops, trainings, educational programs and increase our presence in the community. Our reintroduced Holocaust and Genocide lecture series continues to be a popular topic that draws in the interest of many of our community members. Throughout the year, several of our faculty members have presented on various topics in environmental science, arts and culture, business and health and wellness. The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office hosted two-week long Crisis Intervention training programs for law enforcement agencies throughout the county. They trained attendees on responding to mental health issues in the community and how to effectively handle crisis situations.

In April, we hosted our 1st Transfer Information Session. Representatives from Admissions, Academic Advising, Financial Aid and the Bursar's Office were present to answer questions and assist potential transfer students and their families with information about the University. Additionally we co-host, monthly instant decision days with Admissions allowing transfer students to gain instant admission to the University throughout the year.

The accelerated nursing students obtained approval from the Office of Student Development for the first Manahawkin student club, the Stockton Manahawkin Nursing Club. The nursing students also offered a Healthy Aging Lecture Series on various health topics including; chair exercise & blood pressure screenings, medication adherence, depression & aging and in-home safety to community members and students. Additionally, our Stockton Center On Successful Aging (SCOSA) programs continue to enjoy consistent participation by community members.

We continue to increase opportunities for student engagement and participation in Ocean County. We hope that you find this report to be informative and invite you to come visit us soon!

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





Enrollment by Grade Level





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
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
Look Ahead

During the fall 2018 and spring 2019 semesters a total of 383 students took the Stockton at Manahawkin survey. The following data represents their responses.


When are you most interested in taking classes?

Which services from the Galloway Campus would you like to see in Manahawkin?




