Director's Message

We are pleased to offer this annual report for Stockton's newly designated Additional Location. Stockton University at Manahawkin. Included are the accomplishments from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. We hosted Stockton's first ever cohort of students in the Accelerated Bachelor of Science Nursing program. As a result, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education has recognized the Manahawkin Instructional Site to be an Additional Location under the accreditation. institution's This indicates that the institution offers at least 50 percent of an educational program at a location that is geographically apart from the main campus.



Our professional staff increased their collaborative efforts with Stockton faculty and staff to sponsor a growing number of workshops and seminars for our students and community members. We continued to cultivate and strengthen our partnership with the School of Business and our local Chamber of Commerce to offer a series of workshops and sessions designed for businesses in the region. Additionally, members of our staff served as facilitators and presenters for various volunteerism and grant writing efforts aimed to support our Ocean County based nonprofit organizations. We are most proud of our continued academic growth in Manahawkin and are pleased to report that our student enrollment increased from 549 students to a total of 595 students for an overall increase of 8.38 percent.

We will be offering the new hybrid RN-BSN Nursing program beginning in the fall of 2017, while continuing to have expanded course offerings in the Bachelor of Science in Health Science (BSHS) program. expansion into additional space in Manahawkin that features health science programs is being planned. The new space will include nursing and health science skills labs, a 40-seat classroom, faculty offices, conference room, and student lounge space. We look forward to opening in early 2018.

Students are enrolled in a variety of general studies and program courses that are hybrid and module-free. Students also have the opportunity to take a variety of courses with a service-learning attribute. We are the current home of Stockton's Accelerated Nursing Program and beginning in the fall of 2017 will be the designated location for the new hybrid RN-BSN program.



Engagement

Students in Manahawkin foster partnerships with local nonprofit and for-profit agencies through our volunteer and service-learning programs. As active members of The Southern Ocean County Chamber of Commerce, our faculty and staff provide education for our local businesses. Students, faculty and staff participate in offering educational programs that enrich the lives of the participants.



Global Perspectives

We offer a multitude of cultural and historical workshops that examine international and diverse topics and comprehensive points of view. Topics include, Holocaust and genocide, Colombia, Cuba, China, the History of Philadelphia and diversity in the workforce. Our faculty possess rich educational and cultural backgrounds, which allows them to provide students with a global perspective.



Sustainability

Our natural science and mathematics courses routinely participate in environmentally oriented community service projects.

Students work with conservancy groups such as Project Terrapin, Alliance for a Living Ocean, the Marine Mammal Stranding Center, as well as government agencies including the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife and the Department of Environmental Protection.





We collaborated with the *School of Business* to present three **workshops** for local and regional business owners and our students. Topics discussed included Cybersecurity, Diversity in the Workforce, and How to Prepare for Tax Season.





We worked with the Southern Ocean County Chamber of Commerce to host a workshop series for nonprofit organizations. Topics included Grant Writing with Patty Weeks of the SRI-ETTC and Volunteerism with Erin O'Hanlon and Daniel Tomé of The







Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service is part of our institutional commitment to serve and engage the community. Ninety-seven individuals dedicated their time to six service projects. We partnered with Project Terrapin, a local terrapin & turtle conservation organization, to put together 2000 terrapin information pamphlets, 150 By-catch Reduction Devices (BRDs) for crab traps, and assemble 25 turtle nest covers. Businesses and individuals donated items to create over 150 necessity bags for those in need in both Ocean and Atlantic Counties. Site staff and faculty collected ingredients for recipe cards for 50 nutritious one-bag meals that were assembled and distributed to a local food pantry. Other activities of the day included a clothing drive for Pinelands Regional Junior High School students in need, compiling data for the Lighthouse International Film Festival, and designing greeting cards for children, aging adults, and Veterans.



In conjunction with the Office of Service-Learning, we hosted a Voter Registration Drive for students and the community.

Nearly 14% of Manahawkin students registered to vote, as well as several community members.

In partnership with the Bay Avenue Community Center, students in Dr. Arnaldo Cordero-Román's *Documentary Photography* course hosted an **art reception**. The community was invited to attend and interact with the students who discussed their work. Dr. Cordero-Román also hosted two photography **presentations** about his travel to Havana, Cuba and Colombia.





Dr. Jess Bonnan-White, Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice, hosted а series of three workshops on Humanitarian Action. During these seminars, she issued surveys to participants to gather research on their perceptions of international security and humanitarian topics. This was made possible through a grant provided by Stockton Center on Successful Aging.





Stockton University at Manahawkin utilized newspapers, electronic billboards, social media sites, direct mailings, and 35,000 printed copies of the Escape Guide, distributed statewide to enhance our awareness campaign.

In addition, we increased our social media presence by advertising on **Facebook** and hosting several **Snapchat Takeovers** of the University's Snapchat account.






Enrollment 2016-2017



During the fall 2016 and spring 2017 semesters a total of 347 students took the Stockton at Manahawkin survey. The following data represents their responses.


Why did you enroll in a course in Manahawkin?




When are you most interested in taking classes?


