In addition to her years of experience in higher education administration at the University, Wagner was a tenured faculty member in Management Science.

She was named an American Council on Education (ACE) Fellow and in 2005-2006 worked as an ACE Fellow at the University at Albany. In this prestigious ACE appointment, Dr. Wagner was mentored by the late President, Kermit Hall. As an ACE Fellow, she worked on projects to improve course availability and lobbied successfully for a \$25 million capital project for campus revitalization at the University at Albany.
