Travelers will walk on the stone paths of Mystra, a preserved medieval city on a Peloponnesian mountainside, as well as Athens and the Acropolis and the museums and modern attractions of Athens, which hosted the 2004 Olympics.

The tour includes Delphi, Mycenae, Mystra, Epidavros, Pylos and four nights on the island of Kefalonia. Superior hotels with views, breakfast and some other meals are included.
