Atlantic City, NJ- The Atlantic City region community will take part in an interfaith ceremony to formally commemorate Yom HaShoah, the Holocaust and Heroism Remembrance Day on Thursday, April 15, 2010.

"The actual date of Yom HaShoah is April 11," said Rabbi Gordon Geller of Temple Emeth Shalom in Margate, Stockton adjunct faculty member and organizer of the event. "This will be our community-wide observation of this special day to remember the millions of Holocaust victims and give recognition to the heroes who risked their lives to resist it."
