**GALLOWAY TWP., NJ**— This year's Holocaust Remembrance Program—Yom HaShoah Service for 2007 is "Remembering the Victims of the Holocaust—Unto Every Person There Is A Name". This program is free and open to the public and is being offered at Congregation Beth Judah on Tuesday, April 17, 2007 at 7:30 PM.

Program highlights include local Holocaust survivors and a memorial service. The keynote speaker will be Mrs. Luna Fuss Kaufman. Born in Krakow, Poland, Luna now lives in New Jersey. She is a survivor of the Krakow Ghetto and Plaszow and Skarzysko Kamienna Concentration Camps as well as a survivor of a death march. Death marches were the forced marches of concentration camp prisoners. The SS guards were ordered to and did shoot hundreds of prisoners who collapsed or could not keep up with others on the march. Those prisoners who were shot were among the casualties of thousands of prisoners who died on these marches, many who died of exposure, starvation, and exhaustion. Mrs. Kaufman has dedicated her adult life to sharing the lessons of the Holocaust. Luna is proud of her achievements and work toward developing better Jewish-Christian relations. In a recent interview, she stated, "My main goal in life today after the Holocaust is reaffirming my Jewish identity and reaching out to other religions. I talk to everyone about the lessons and the legacy of the Holocaust."
