Stockton to Offer Calculus at Holy Spirit

Five-Credit Course to be Tailored to High School Schedule

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GALLOWAY TWP., NJ – The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey will be offering calculus this fall at Holy Spirit High School and will award five college credits to students who successfully complete the course.

"This is an example of Stockton's community outreach and a good opportunity for Holy Spirit students to earn valuable college credits and experience," said Dennis Weiss, Stockton's Dean of Natural Science and Mathematics.

The Rev. Joseph Perreault, President and Principal of Holy Spirit will participate in a signing ceremony to finalize the agreement with Stockton President Herman J. Saatkamp, Jr. on Monday, June 18 at 1:30 p.m. in the President's Board Room (K-203k on the Galloway Township campus.) Also taking part in the ceremony will be Evelyn DiMaria, Holy Spirit's Director of Student Personnel Services, Dean Weiss and Stockton Provost David Carr.

Approximately 20 Holy Spirit students have pre-qualified and anticipate taking part in the class, to be taught by Dr. Renganathan Iyer, Coordinator of Stockton's Mathematics Program. The course is normally a semester class at Stockton, but will be tailored to fit the year-long high school schedule at Holy Spirit.

While this is the first joint academic project undertaken by the institutions, Stockton does have a longstanding relationship with Holy Spirit on a different level. The College's pool has been the "home" of the Spartan's boys' and girls' swim teams for the past 18 seasons.

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
