Galloway Township, NJ– The Stockton Performing Arts Center in conjunction with The Greater Ocean City Theatre Company presents "How I Became a Pirate" on Wednesday, July 23 as part of Stockton Summer Playhouse's lineup.

"How I Became a Pirate" tells the story of Jeremy Jacob, who is digging in the sand at North Beach when he is greeted by Captain Braid Beard and his mates, and is recruited to help find the perfect digging spot for their treasure. Boarding the ship, the captain introduces the boy to his pirate crew who share with him the ins and outs of a pirate's life at sea. The pirate world proves to have many surprises for Jeremy Jacob but he realizes that it is always good to go home and that the simple things in life, like a kiss and a warm tucking in at night, are among those that are most important. This is a story of adventure and finding one's own heart - a path that can't be found on any treasure map!

"How I Became a Pirate" is based on the book of the same name, written by Melinda Long and illustrations by David Shannon, and performed by arrangement with Houghton Mifflin Harcourt and The Sandra Dijkstra Literary Agency and Theatrical Rights Worldwide. GOCTC's commitment to dance, music and theatre education for youth continues to grow. GOCTC staff members run theatre camps through the Department of Recreation and with the Ocean City POPS. GOCTC has established a Junior Company that features area youth in several fully staged productions.

In 2011, the board of directors and staff officially restructured the company to adopt the name Greater Ocean City Theatre Company. This re-branding allows for growth and support of the company's vision of performing arts around the Delaware Valley.
