Galloway, N.J. - The public is invited to an opening reception of "Hammonton: 150 Years of Agriculture," an exhibit that celebrates the town's farming roots, hosted by Stockton University's Kramer Hall instructional site as part of Hammonton's Third **Thursday, Sept. 15** from 6 - 8 p.m.

The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University has partnered with Stockton University faculty and staff, the South Jersey Culture and History Center, and the Town of Hammonton to present two exhibitions celebrating the town's Sesquicentennial. The newest exhibition highlighting agriculture is now open and will run until Dec. 31.
