Galloway, NJ – Stockton University will host a free lecture titled, "The Holocaust Impact on the Environment" as part of the Holocaust & Genocide program series. The lecture will be held at the Manahawkin Instructional Site, located at 712 E. Bay Ave. in Manahawkin, N.J. on **Wednesday, April 6 at noon**. Lunch will be provided.

The presentation will explore the environmental impacts of mass graves, the smoke and ashes of crematoria, and open pits from the Holocaust to present day.

Nicole Schielzo, a senior at Stockton University, will present research that has examined the harmful effects in the air and ground due to the compounds produced from the cremation, smoke and ash.

Schielzo is set to graduate in the spring of 2016 with a major in Environmental Science and a minor in Biology.
