The production will take place from **Wednesday, Feb. 17-Sunday, Feb. 21**.

Written by Mindy Kaling (best known as writer and actress for television shows The Mindy Project and The Office) and Brenda Withers, "Matt and Ben" is set in 1995 and tells the story of Matt Damon and Ben Affleck when they were struggling actors, long before anyone knew or cared who they were. In an odd turn of events, the heavens open up and down falls the screenplay of "Good Will Hunting." In this hour-long comic ride, we see the pair going through ups and downs in Affleck's run-down Boston apartment. To make things even more amusing, Damon and Affleck are played by two women.

The cast consists of two talented actors, Madelaine Welch, of Galloway, as Ben Affleck and Erica Delbury, of Little Egg Harbor, as Matt Damon.
