The beauty of crochet is in its flexibility. Knowing how to make a single and a double crochet can create hundreds of beautiful stitches and patterns. If you know how to crochet, chances are you know how to crochet lace. With crochet lace you can create jewelry, scarves, wraps and more.

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In this class, participants will learn the basics of crochet lace: the basic stitches, how to choose the right materials, how to follow patterns, and how to create designs. Learn with a few simple, logical steps, progressing from the basics to a completion of a lace necklace of intricate beauty.

Artist, designer and creator Asal arrived in the United States from Turkey nearly a decade ago and began creating one-of-a-kind pieces of wearable art in this age-old tradition. She has modernized the look while staying true to the techniques she perfected on her own. The result is a beautiful collection celebrating this unique fusion. Handcrafted lace work is a century-old technique. The skills required to master this art have been handed down from generation to generation. Asal honed her skills at design and technical schools in Turkey. She now owns and operates Anatolia Art & Craft Studio in Atlantic City.
