Galloway Township, NJ- The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) is sponsoring three drawing workshops for older adults at the Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton College this summer.

The Wednesday workshops, presented by local artist David Rhodes, are scheduled for **June 11, July 9 and August 13, 2014** from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Noyes Museum, located at 733 Lily Lake Road in the Oceanville section of Galloway Township.

Participants will learn the basic skills and techniques of drawing by focusing on observational rendering, use of line, shading, mark making, elements of composition and creativity. They will build technical skills and develop personal expression by drawing from a variety of subjects.

This class is geared toward mature adults, but all adults are welcome. Basic supplies will be provided. A \$10 per class material fee will be collected by the Noyes Museum at the time of registration. If there is an interest, classes will be continued through the fall.
