Galloway Township, NJ- The Stockton Center on Successful Aging's "A Tour of Poetry for Seniors" will feature Cherry Hill poet David Worrell as he performs his works to music at the Otto Bruyns Public Library of Northfield.

Worrell will discuss the relationship between poetry and music while sharing his own unique blend of rhymes and rhythms on **Saturday, March 8, 2014** from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Worrell hosts the Moonstone Arts poetry series on the third Wednesday of every month at Fergie's Pub in Center City Philadelphia.

The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) partnered with the Otto Bruyns Public Library of Northfield to sponsor the ongoing senior poetry workshop series titled "A Tour of Poetry for Seniors." The Otto Bruyns Public Library of Northfield is located at 241 West Mill Road in Northfield.

Workshops are held one Saturday each month from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and include a lecture on poetry and reading from a visiting poet. A light luncheon is offered, compliments of the Library and local food service businesses.

On **Saturday, April 5, 2014**, the Library will host a poetry gathering for readings of personal poetry and an open discussion. Sessions are also scheduled for May through June. At the culmination of the series, an intergenerational poetry celebration will take place with participants in the Library's high school poetry workshop series.
