All General Studies, Natural Science and Mathematics, and Social and Behavioral Science candidates will participate in a ceremony at 2:00 p.m. In addition, there will be a special "Hooding Ceremony" to give extra recognition to the Masters Degree candidates. This event will take place 8:30 a.m. in the Stockton Performing Arts Center.

William L. The College will also pay tribute to Gormley with words from President Herman J. Saatkamp, Jr., during the afternoon ceremony. In the morning ceremony, Gormley will be conferred with a Doctor of Laws, honoris causa by Dr. Clarence Hoover, III Chair of the College Board of Trustees, and by President Saatkamp.
