

Stockton Hosts Creation, Destruction of Buddhist Medicine Mandala During Tibetan Culture Week

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Galloway, NJ – Stockton University will feature the construction and destruction of the Medicine Buddha Mandala during Tibetan Culture Week from **Monday, March 28 – Friday, April 1.** The weeklong event will feature a series of activities presented by Tibetan monks from the Drepung Gomang Monastery as part of their <u>Sacred Art Tour</u>. All events are free and open to the public.

The mandala, a geometric figure representing the universe in Hindu and Buddhist symbolism, will be worked on by the monks every day from about 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The creation of the intricate colored sand mandala is a Tibetan Buddhist tradition in which the mandala is ritualistically dismantled upon its completion. The destruction symbolizes the impermanent nature of material life.

Jongbok Yi, assistant professor of Asian Philosophy and Religion at Stockton, coordinated the monks' visit. The university's Production Services department will record the construction of the mandala to create a time-lapse video.
