Sara Toscano, of Egg Harbor Township, N.J., earned her B.S. in Political Science in December 2015, after transferring from Rutgers-New Brunswick. "I chose to study at Stockton because I really valued how small the class sizes were after being at such a large university," Toscano said. "I made so many connections and positive experiences at Stockton, but I was still challenging myself." She will begin studies at American University Law School in the fall.

Stockton offers transfer students unique support, including first semester transfer seminars with courses that count toward their majors, but which are tailored to their needs.

"The seminars provide an encouraging environment in which transfer students can make the transition over the course of a semester, rather than a two- or three-hour orientation," said Thomas Grites, assistant provost – Academic Support Services. "One survey showed that students who took the transfer seminars returned for the next semesters and have a strong overall graduation rate," he said.
