The event will celebrate three award recipients. The 2012 honorees are:

- Lifetime Award recipient: Mr. Adalberto "Bert" Lopez, Manager of Government and Public Affairs, Atlantic City Electric. Bert is the producer and host of the weekly TV interview show "Latino Motion with Bert Lopez" which airs on NBC40. Bert has a passion for community service and has helped to raise thousands of dollars in scholarships through the "Festival Latino Americano" as former president of the Hispanic Alliance of Atlantic City.
- Merit Award recipient: Dr. Eileen P. Conran-Folks, Manager, Hammonton Center and Noyes Museum, The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey. Eileen has served as an administrator in higher education for more than 30 years, including 22 years at Stockton where she served as the Dean of Students and Assistant Vice President for the Division of Student Affairs. Eileen has represented the College on several community based

partnerships and is a founding member and faculty advisor to Stockton's Omicron Delta Kappa Honor Society.

 Distinguished Alumnus recipient: Mrs. Ariane Newman '90, Assistant Director of Continuing Studies, The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey. Ariane coordinates professional development opportunities for health and human service professionals. Ariane is an adjunct professor in the public health program at the College, as well as an alumni mentor. She is a licensed Health Officer and Registered Environmental Health Specialist in the state of New Jersey, and is a board member of several South Jersey community organizations.

"The Council's annual dinner and dance is one of the most eagerly-anticipated events at the College," Council President Patricia W. Collins said. "It is an opportunity for colleagues to enjoy each other's company while helping our deserving students.
