Pedestrian Safety is a big problem in New Jersey

- An average 170 pedestrians are killed in New Jersey every year.
- Pedestrians account for 22 percent of all motor vehicle-related fatalities in New Jersey.
- Pedestrian deaths and injuries in New Jersey cost an estimated 340 million dollars a year.
- Children and senior citizens are at special risk.

Pedestrian Safety is a Shared Responsibility!

Motorists:

- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Failure to yield carries a \$44 fine and a 2 point license penalty (39:4-36).
- Watch for pedestrians when turning right on red.
- Obey speed limits.
- Do not block or park in crosswalks.
- Keep your windshield clean for maximum visibility.
- Stay sober. Don't drive while drowsy or impaired.
- Be alert for pedestrians at all times!

Pedestrians:

- Always cross at the corner and look both ways.
- Obey traffic signals, especially "Walk/Don't Walk".
- Remain alert. Don't assume that cars are going to stop.
- Wear reflective clothing when walking at night.
- Stay sober. Walking while impaired greatly increases your chance of being struck.
- Parents, teach your children safe walking habits.
- Be especially careful during bad weather.
