Young Women's Conference in STEM



Egg Harbor Township Students from Fernwood Avenue Middle School and EHT High School attended the "Young Women's Conference in STEM" in the Princeton Plasma Physics Laboratory (PPPL) at Princeton University on Friday March 18th, 2016.

Pantelia Bairaktaris, Associate Director for the Office of Research & Sponsored Programs along with Jill Pappas, Guidance Counselor at Fernwood Middle School were the trip chaperones. Ms. Bairaktaris worked with the conference staff from Princeton and James Battersby, Principal of Fernwood Middle School to register the students and make this an educational school field trip. Students experienced science hands on as participants within the actual experiments, watched a live chemistry experiment show, and attended lectures given by lead scientists focusing on careers in science and health care.
