Seeking proposals for research, education and outreach, innovative projects, or sponsorships that are not addressed through NOAA's competitive discretionary programs. Proposals must address one or more of the following four mission goals described in the NOAA Strategic Plan: Climate Adaptation and Mitigation; Weather-Ready Nation; Healthy Oceans; and Resilient Coastal Communities and Economies.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until September 30, 2017. Awards will generally support projects lasting up to one year.
