
R&PD: Spring 2017 Course Release –


Thank you to all of the faculty and staff for your contributions and the impressive show of presentations, published works, books published, board involvement and more.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has [announced](#) that it now requires all original science journal articles produced by NASA-funded research to be made available free of charge on its new public web portal, [PubSpace](#). The Faculty Alert System is an automated, monthly e-mail system containing funding opportunities tailored to each faculty member's specific needs. The alerts may include federal and private funding opportunities, with application deadlines extending out three months. As faculty needs will continually change, participants have the ability to alter their criteria at anytime.

NAEd/Spencer - Postdoctoral Fellowship Program

The National Academy of Education/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship Program supports early career scholars working in critical areas of education research. This non-residential postdoctoral fellowship funds proposals that make significant scholarly contributions to the field of education. The program also develops the careers of its recipients through professional development activities involving National Academy of Education members.

The NAEd/Spencer Postdoctoral Fellowship Program is open to all eligible applicants regardless of race, national origin, religion, gender, age, disability, or sexual orientation.
