Dani Cranmer is a licensed social worker and is currently the Tribal Office Administrator of the Nanticoke Lenape Tribal Nation. Dani is a member of the Acjachemem Nation of Southern California. A dedicated Native American activist, Dani runs two Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women's Groups, and Chaa'ishmal Foundation, a Native American Science, Religion, Education, and Native American Support Services. Chaa'ishmal aims to increase and promote protective factors against the adverse conditions of indigenous people face. Dani has taught classes in BioEthics, Humanities and BioPsychology in academic settings.
