SUSI continues to be used by faculty in SOBL and Health Science to provide active learning experiences for students. Faculty from Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Nursing, Social Work, and Speech Therapy use SUSI in classes to provide students with active learning experiences to practice skills necessary for their future careers. Faculty and students have consistently rated these experiences positively and students in particular continue to request more learning experiences like this. Grant Bolopue has successfully recruited student, faculty, and community actors and the actors have also reinforced the value of this experience for practicing their own craft as well as assisting students to learn.

Two objectives for SUSI, to foster an interactive environment among students, faculty, staff and community, and to deliver high value learning activities were met. The interaction among faculty and students has been very positive in planning simulation activities, in performing these activities, and in the debriefing after these activities. This outcome is supported by the evaluations that are collected from participants, from student reflective journal entries, and anecdotal comments.

The second objective, to Increase opportunities for interactions between internal and external communities has been a bigger challenge and has been partially met. Although Renee Myers from Atlanticare participated on this initial proposal, and we have subsequently reached out to community partners informing them of SUSI, created a website, and two community partners have reached out to employ SUSI for health care provider simulation activities, we have yet to actually offer one at an area hospital, clinic, or office setting. Virtua contacted Grant last summer to schedule a simulation but actors were unavailable at that time. Atlanticare has requested and received more information to use the actors in a suicide prevention simulation for their healthcare staff but has not followed through on scheduling this activity. We will continue to promote SUSI in the community and have confidence that our clinical partners will respond and also participate in a successful and satisfactory SUSI activities in the future.
