Agenda/Business: Stockton Student Senate met on October 25th, 2016; to vote on supplemental requested from multiple clubs, to swear in applicant Senators, and newly elected Senators.

Approval of Minutes

President Sarhan called the meeting to order at 04:34 pm and motioned to approve the minutes of September 27th, 2016: Which was seconded by Chair Solowey.

President's Report

President Sarhan announced that on Sunday October 16th there was a gas leak that affected about 215 students in Juniper building and B-court. President Sarhan thanked the Dean of Students Office, Office of Residential life and everyone who took swift action to correct this issue.

President Sarhan reported that she was able to work with the Dean of Students office to deliver food to particularly assist students who are without a meal plan and were not able to utilize their apartments to cook food.

President Sarhan thanked everyone who assisted in this matter, including Craig Stambaugh, Dr. Pedro Santana and Tom O'Donnell.

President Sarhan thanked everyone who came out to Wing Night this past Tuesday evening! President Sarhan reported that she will be having a meeting with Jessica Grullion this week to touch up and send out the student survey on their perspective of shared governance at Stockton as members of the Shared Governance taskforce. Dinner with the Dean this month was with the Muslim Student Association on Thursday October 13th. President Sarhan hopes that we each take part in a conscientious effort to curb all harassment and discrimination of any kind. President Sarhan announced the Climate survey about diversity on Stockton's campus, and thanked Dianne Stalling for the great multicultural month events on campus.

President Sarhan reported that the monthly meeting with Faculty Senate President Brian Tyrell on October 12^{th} also went well, and student nominations to their standing committees have been submitted and currently awaiting for approval by the Faculty Senate. President Sarhan also mentioned that the Student Senate has partnered with Tom O'Donnell's freshmen seminar class to host the Student Leader Forum, Thursday October 27^{th} , 8:30 am – 10:30 am.

President Sarhan thanked the Hughes Center for hosting the Legislator in Residence, State Senator Loretta Weinberg visited the Senate on Tuesday October 18th and that Student Senate appreciates the time she spent with us.

Club of the month was awarded to Stockton Student TV, for their continued hard work and amazing accomplishments that usually go unnoticed.

President Sarhan concluded her report.

Vice President's Report

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Vice President Victoria Dambroski for the Vice President's report.

Vice President Dambroski swore-in the newly accepted Senators from the freshman and transfer election, and motioned to accept the vacancy applications into the Stockton Student Senate Organization through procedural vote.

There is a motion on the floor to approve the Student Senate Vacancy Applications for: Thomas Lloyd.

Vice President Dambroski announced that the new bike share program through the partnership of residential life, through a key fob system, is currently working towards full deployment and completion.

Vice President Dambroski stated that the Students Helping Students mentoring program is currently under review to potentially become an independent club program, and is working to open the program to a larger base of students to help high school students in transition.

Vice President Dambroski reminded the body that the next Inner-Club Council meeting is going to take place on December 6th, at 8:15PM at Alton Auditorium, with President Sarhan and Chair Solowey in attendance to address your concerns.

Vice President Dambroski concluded her report and yielded the floor back to President Sarhan.

Finance

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Chairman Solowey for the Finance Committee report.

Chair Solowey reported that there are 4 supplemental requests to the finance committee that will be voted upon today, and that there is a special rules provision located within the minutes. There are also requests that were already approved by the Finance Committee and Signed by the Vice President.

Chair Solowey reported that the supplemental fund is currently valued at \$88,654.91. The supplemental fund will be valued at \$63,077.21 if all supplemental are approved at the amount suggested by the Finance Committee.

Chair Solowey reported and moved the following supplemental requests on the Senate Floor:

Stockton Speech and Hearing Club's request for \$3,202.22, to attend the American Association for Speech and Hearing on November 18th,2016.

There is a motion on the floor to approve the supplemental request by Stockton Speech and Hearing Club in the amount of \$3,202.22. The request is for attending the American Association for Speech and Hearing conference. This conference is a supplement to their educational studies and self-research purposes.

The President of the Stockton Speech and Hearing Club said that the conference is to assist in professional development, and that the conference is open to all students besides being active in the club and holding the relevant major. Stockton Speech and Hearing Club also hosted a Yankee candle fundraiser which determined points of preference for people to attend the convention.

Muslim Student Association's request for \$1,994.42, for a speaker and presentation on the effect on 'Islamophobia in Politics', located in the Campus Center Theater on November 2nd, 2016.

There is a motion on the floor to approve the supplemental request by Muslim Student Association in the amount of \$1,994.42. The request is for inviting the speaker and to supplement the fees for the event itself. This event is to bring comedy and to inform the Stockton Community.

The Executive Board from MSA announced that the speaker and comedian Jeremy McLellan, would speak on the issues of islamophobia and racism that is being observed in the recent 2016 election.

Senator Second: Chair Richardson Senators Abstained: President Sarhan

Stockton Model United Nation's request for 6,452.18, for 24 students to attend the National Model United Nations conference from April 9th – 13^{th} , 2017.

There is a motion on the floor to approve the supplemental request by Stockton Model United Nations in the amount of \$6,452.18. The request is to offset the cost of attending the conference. This conference is to supplement educational interests and present research done by the Model United Nations Team.

The President of Stockton United Nations and the Treasurer announced that the conference is to discuss world events and politics in a mock simulation of which Stockton will be representing a country. Treasurer Jessica Cathcart said there will be an extensive application to attend to demonstrate the level of commitment needed to participate in the simulation.

Motion Passed: 25-0-1

Senator Second: Senator Ritter Senators Abstained: President Sarhan

Stockton University's All Stars Dance Team request for \$7,000.00, for 22 students to attend the UDA National Dance Competition in Orlando, Florida during January $12^{\text{th}} - 16^{\text{th}}$, 2017.

There is a motion on the floor to approve the supplemental request by Stockton University's All Stars Dance Team request in the amount of \$7,000.00. The request is to offset the cost of attending the conference. This conference is to supplement educational interests and present research done by the Model United Nations Team.

The Executive Board from the All Stars Dance Team stated that the Team is willing and making every effort to make the team legitimate to compete regionally and nationally. The All Stars Dance team stated that they are also contributing their flight, costumes, and the camp they had to attend to qualify for the competition. The current supplemental is to offset the cost of the music and production for the routine to go to the competition.

Finance Committee Special Rules:

Fiscal Year 2016/2017 Finance Committee Special Rules

- 1) Priority will be given to conferences and travel that benefit the club or organization's function on campus, as compared to professional development or individual post graduate benefits.
- 2) Only **One** multi-day conference per club per semester will be funded, unless all the students going did not go on the previous multi-day conference.
- 3) Clubs will be required to present or hold an activity/event about the conference that they attended. Events can include a lecture series, presentations to students, etc.
- 4) Clubs will be required to bring detailed price quotes, complete travel packets, and all other pertinent information to the supplemental meeting. Failure to bring the aforementioned information will result in immediate denial until that information is provided.

- Chairman Patton Solowey Finance Committee Chairman Stockton University Student Senate

Chair Solowey stated that the special rules passed at the committee level and does not need a procedural vote on the full senate floor to be valid.

Chair Solowey concluded his report and yielded the floor back to President Sarhan.

Academic Affairs

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Chairman Moore Jr. for the Academic Affairs report.

Chair Moore Jr. reported that Senator Gernale met with Director Scott Houston, and were updated on the website changes coming to the official homepage.

Chair Moore Jr. reported that the Academic Affairs committee successfully tabled for and urged students to have a higher rate of minor participation in collaboration with their major. An informational packet was made with all of the basic information for the committee, and how to sign up for a minor through academic advising for students. Chair Moore Jr. thanked Senator Macwan for his continued help and participation in tabling for higher minor participation.

Chair Moore Jr. reported that Senator Ritter met with Campus Event Services and with representatives from the Office of Campus Center Graduate Coordinator to possibly have free coffee available to students during finals week.

Chair Moore Jr. stated that he was appointed as a representative to the Faculty Senate Committee on Faculty Programs, Senator Gernale was appointed to Academic Policies, and Senator Ritter was appointed to the Space Committee.

Chair Moore Jr. yielded his time back to President Sarhan.

Government Affairs

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Chairwomen Hanvey for the Government Affairs report.

Chair Hanvey stated that they have being working very closely with SSTV for "Student Senate Works", a video documenting what Student Senate has done so far, and for the video about Wing Night.

Chair Hanvey reported that they will be hosting an event called "Pizza and Politics" on November 10th, 2016, in which Students will be able to ask questions and play bingo to win prizes based on who won the Presidential and Congressional election. Senator Patel stated that Government Affairs has been working very closely with Service Learning to actively push civic engagement on Campus, and have a Student Driven van for the election to take students to a local polling place for students who are registered to vote in Atlantic County.

Chair Hanvey reported that Stockton will be holding a mock election to get a feel of how Stockton is leaning in the election.

Chair Hanvey concluded her report and yielded her time back to President Sarhan.

Public Relations

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Chairwomen Richardson for the Public Relations report.

Chair Richardson reported that the Public Relations committee thanked all of the Senators who helped table for the elections, and thanked all of the support staff that assisted with the election software. Chair Richardson stated that elections took place October 11th-13th (12PM-12PM).

Chair Richardson reported that there were 719 votes casted in total, and congratulated the new Senators who were recently sworn in.

Chair Richardson thanked all of the students and senators who turned out to Student Senate Wing Night, and that the Public Relations committee hopes to host another one during this semester. Chair Richardson stated that the 'Pie a Senator' event is currently on hold, and that a fundraiser for the Foundation Scholarship event with Chipotle is currently being explored.

Chair Richardson concluded her report and yielded the floor back to President Sarhan.

Student Affairs

President Sarhan yielded the floor to Chairwomen Bulgia for the Student Affairs committee report.

Chair Bulgia congratulated all of the new Senators who were recently sworn in.

Chair Bulgia announced that the parking town hall event in collaboration with Parking Manager Michael Sullivan on October 5th, 2016 was a success. Students at this event voiced their concerns and presented their opinions to Manager Sullivan in an open setting.

Chair Bulgia reported that there is a "Weekend Dining Survey" in the works, in collaboration with Director of Information Services Scott Huston. It will be sent out to all students, in order to assess the need for more dining options on campus, and to gauge a possible changing of hours of operations for dining services on the weekends.

Chair Bulgia stated that Senator Macwan met with Shuttle Services to implement the counter clockwise shuttle pattern so students are no longer waiting extended periods to get a shuttle. Chair Bulgia stated that they are looking into implementing a 7:30 AM shuttle for Seaview students, since there is not enough time for them to get breakfast before class with an 8:00 AM shuttle for 8:30 classes. Chair Bulgia stated that she will be meeting with Daniel Tomey with Service Learning, to see how more clubs can reach out and participate in service learning. Senator Guilietti is going to be working with Public Relations to reach out to the students to inform them about the reading and video resources the library has available to them.

Chairwomen Bulgia concluded her report and yielded the floor to President Sarhan.

Announcements/Comments from the Public:

President Sarhan opened the floor to the public.

Vice President Dambroski stated she is proud of all of Senate's accomplishments and thanked all of the club leaders in attendance for their passion for their organizations.

Chair Hanvey reminded the body that the election is on November 8th, and it is important to vote and have your voice heard.

Chair Richardson stated that the Public Relation Committee is open to help any club or organization if they need help with a flyer or getting the message out.

Senator Patel thanked Stockton University Model United Nations for their message to the global community.

President Sarhan stated that the mentor program is open and CARE program is in need for volunteers.

Associate Dean of Students Davis reminded the body that Lala-No-Booza, is coming up on Thursday and urged everyone come out.

Model United Nations President Dominic Tierno stated that they are working on a partnership with the United Nations, and hopes to have Student Senate's support in the upcoming application process.

Dr. Santana reminded the Senators, and the new Senators that they are the representatives of the student body. Dr. Santana stated that he hopes that Student Senate continues to be a force of unity despite dispersions in the current election cycle. Dr. Santana reported that 'Drop in with the Dean' is taking place on November 10th.

President Sarhan announced that the next full Senate meeting will take place on November 15th, 2016 at 4:30 PM in the TLRC.

Adjournment

President Sarhan stated that the meeting was adjourned at 5:37 PM.



President's Report to the Stockton Community:

November 15th, 2016

Statement on behalf of the Student Senate:

In light of recent events that have happened both on our campus and around the nation, we hope that all members of the Stockton community continually take part in the efforts to make this campus a safe and inclusive one. The Student Senate unequivocally condemns all forms of harassment, threats, discrimination directed towards any members of the Stockton community. Racial slurs, hate crimes, bias crimes, and any behavior whatsoever that targets the race, religion, sexual orientation, or any other aspect of one's identity will not be tolerated. We will work tirelessly to ensure that we make Stockton a safe place for all students.

On the evening of November 7th, a student informed me that a racist and derogatory term often directed at individuals of Asian descent was written in multiple places in the F Wing staircase area. Upon learning of this incident I immediately contacted key administrators who swiftly responded and took immediate action. Dr. Kesselman's mass message to the Stockton community illustrates Stockton's commitment to standing against behavior such as this one. I would also like to sincerely thank Chief of Police Cynthia Parker and the efforts of the Police Department as they continue to investigate this incident. I met with Chief Parker Wednesday and Friday of last week to discuss proper protocol and this specific incident. Along with other offices, Chief Parker and I will be working on an infographic that will serve as a guide for students who are unsure of what to do in situations such as this or when they are experiencing harassment or any other inappropriate behavior. We ask that you please immediately contact Campus Police when you feel unsafe or threatened. We hope to have this infographic finalized within the week.

Victoria and I met with a student group on Wednesday, November 9th to provide further support to students who have concerns in regards to the campus climate following the election. On Friday November 11th, I had the opportunity to meet with students who were discussing an incident in which a friend was harassed off campus. Additionally, although it is unclear of whether or not this incident was reported, it came to my attention

that a Muslim student on campus was harassed for wearing a hijab. According to my sources student veterans that were present intervened. I am grateful to those students who stood up when they saw something unjust occur.

This past Friday evening on Veteran's Day, the Student Senate presented a special recognition to the Student Veterans of Stockton University. We deeply appreciate their service to our community and their everyday sacrifices for our great nation. We'd also like to thank Stockton's Veteran Affairs program led by Dean Tom O'Donnell for all that they do to provide an exceptional experience for our student veterans.

On Wednesday November 9th, Melanie Cucunato and I met with Trish Krevetski in regards to the opportunity for Stockton to become a Fair Trade campus. We will continue to explore the options for Chartwells/Follet to provide more fair trade products, as well as better advertise the certified products we already have on campus. We also recently heard of Trish's retirement and wish her the very best. Moving forward, our new contact for issues regarding Chartwells, shuttle services, etc. will be Jim Tierney, Associate VP of Business Services and Chief Budget Officer.

The first Campus Walk on November 9th, 11:30-12:45 was a success. We'd like to sincerely thank Dr. Harvey Kesselman for walking throughout campus and meeting new students. This unique opportunity also provided a means for students to have conversations with him and meet their President. Thank you to Senators Christina and Thomas for joining us. Following the Campus Walk, Dr. Kesselman and I had our monthly meeting in which we discussed updates and current projects in progress.

On November 2nd, Dr. Brian Tyrell and I had our monthly meeting in which we discussed the student appointments to the standing committees. We also discussed the topic of priority scheduling for athletes, which is currently a pilot program. In addition, I was also made aware that students with disabilities who are registered with the Learning Access Program also receive priority scheduling. On November 8th, I met with Dr. Denise O'Neil and James King to discuss adding an additional projector in the TRLC to improve the layout of the facility. This effort is in progress as the costs continue to be explored.

Dinner with the Dean on November 8th was with the Latin American Students Association. Student leaders at the dinner expressed their concerns in regards to more options for Weekend Dining, longer hours for the Campus Center, inconsistencies with the shuttle services, and becoming aware of students events and activities to stay engaged. Some suggested bringing back Student Development's "This Week at Stockton" newsletter. With Osprey Hub coming soon in January, we hope this issue will be alleviated. The Senate will continue to work on issues and concerns from the student body as they are brought to our attention.

Victoria and I along with the Senate Chairs recently returned from the Lead365 conference. This conference provided phenomenal sessions on leadership among many

other topics and we look forward to sharing all that we've learned on a presentation date that will soon be determined.

The next Wing Night date is being finalized. The Senate has invited Campus Police to join us on this occasion to create an informal setting to meet students, and serve as a bridge building opportunity.

Lastly, as a friendly reminder this Thursday will be the Annual Student Faculty and Staff Dinner which will be held 5-7 pm in the Campus Center Event Room. We hope that you will join us during this fun evening to have a delicious meal with a faculty or staff member who has positively impacted your experience at Stockton! We'd like to thank our co-sponsors, Student Development and the Campus Religious Council for the collaborative efforts thus far to make this dinner a success.
