Public Relations

Matthew reported that the ACE Hardware donation program raised \$30 and more importantly helped spread the positive message of the Habitat for Humanity charity.

Matthew then stated that the committee worked together to decorate the senate bulletin board with posters supporting the fight against domestic violence. They are also working with the Academic Policies Committee to promote their events during the month of February.

Matthew concluded his report by stating that the committee discussed plans to promote the senate on campus as a leadership opportunity for students.

Academic Policies

Dawn stated that the committee discussed the plans to assist the Covenant House in their "Do 1 Thing" fundraiser. They will be tabling and asking for help from local businesses in obtaining food, clothing, toiletries, and gift cards for the Atlantic City shelter.

Dawn reported that the committee discussed a fundraiser Iris' church is participating in for the people of the Atlantic City Rescue Mission.

Dawn concluded by stating that the committee will be addressing problems with congestion in the bookstore. They will look into encouraging professors to submit textbooks to the bookstore early to prevent long lines.

School Spirit

Danielle stated that the committee discussed plans for the Spring Carnival. They will meet with Chartwells and the bookstore to discuss the event.

Danielle then reported that the committee discussed further plans for the club capsules. There will be a drop-off for all donations on February 19th in the upper G-wing lounge.

Student Welfare

Brian Brateris reported that he tested Webfood and was satisfied with the delivery. He recommended that students get the word out as this service would be great for club meetings.

Duanaya asked how late the delivery service could be used. Robin Gillespie, Senior Director of Dining Services, stated that students should be able to use the service until 11 p.m. for the Osprey's Nest and 10 p.m. for the Lakeside Center.

Brain then stated that he went to the Bookstore to discuss the excessive long waits while making book purchases. Brian reported that the employees agree that professors aren't getting in book orders in time for students to pre-order. Brian will be meeting with the Bookstore again to address the issue further.

Brian stated that Sammy will be contacting Director of Plant Management, Donald Woolslayer, regarding the possible construction of a roof over the hockey rink.

Brian concluded by reporting that Sammy is still speaking with Athletics regarding substitute pool usage for students.

They will be selling t-shirts soon. Joseph Lizza, Assistant Director of the College Center, then announced that with the assistance of Residential Life, the tickets will be discounted to \$5 and they are working on transportation.
