
End Hunger in 30 Challenge, ongoing

2023-24 FAFSA is Available!

The 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available now! File early to be considered for all aid programs for the 2023-2024 academic year, including those with limited funding! File at fafsa.gov! Have questions? Visit stockton.edu/fafsa for more information or stockton.edu/contactfinaid to email or schedule a phone appointment with a member of our staff.

The Federal Student Loan Payment Pause, which includes a suspension of loan payments, a 0% interest rate and stopped collections on defaulted loans will remain in effect through 12/31/22. In addition, qualifying borrowers may be eligible for a one-time debt forgiveness of up to \$10K. Prior Pell Grant recipients could receive up to \$20K in debt forgiveness. Borrowers earning less than \$125,000 for individuals and less than \$250,000 for households are eligible to participate in the program. 




