Your Questions, Answered: Fraternity & Sorority Life

Does Fratenity & Sorority Life exist on Stockton's campus? What is your role?

Stockton University has 30 recognized fraternities and sororities that range from single gender social organizations to all gender service organizations, a pre-health fraternity, and historically Black and Latino organizations. My role at Stockton is to advise these organizations and set perimeters for their continued recognition. I provide training and support and hold them accountable to University policies and procedures.

What are the benefits of a student getting involved in Fratenity & Sorority Life?

Fraternities and sororities have many benefits. Gallup has done several studies to show the long-term impact after college in fact. These organizations are a great vehicle for leadership, service, and philanthropic opportunities. They also act as a support mechanism for its members.

What are some myths about Fratenity & Sorority Life that you'd like to debunk?

There are many myths about fraternities and sororities. We are not without our issues or concerns, but statistically what you see in the news reflects a small portion nationally of what we see on campuses. The most common myths I hear are regards to hazing, alcohol abuse, and paying for friends. Hazing is against University policy and against the law and we have no tolerance for it in our community. In regards to alcohol, our surveys show that our fraternity/sorority members do not consume alcohol any more than the average student. Fraternity and sorority members are probably trained much more about alcohol abuse, bystander intervention, and overall wellness than other students. In regard to "paying for friends" I always find this one funny, because I did not join my fraternity to make friends, nor do most people. This myth shows a great misunderstanding by folks on what fraternities/sororities do. Anything that is worth joining usually has a cost. That is not unordinary. My membership fees go to the operations of the organization including staffing, materials, and insurance. The friendships are free.

Is participating safe?

Joining a fraternity or sorority is safe. We train students each semester to ensure they have the knowledge necessary to succeed and have a safe community. This includes training on hazing prevention, wellness, and risk management.

Are there requirements that a student must meet in order to go out for a fraternity or sorority?

In order for a student to join a fraternity, they must have completed one full semester of college (second semester freshmen) and have a 2.50 GPA minimum. To register and complete pre-joining requirements, they can join the google classroom here.



The Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act

What is FERPA? The Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (also called the Buckley Amendment) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student educational records.

In compliance with federal regulations, Stockton University has adopted institutional policies and procedures regarding the disclosure of information from educational records for current and former students.

FERPA designates certain information related to students as "directory information" and gives Stockton the rights to disclose such information to anyone without obtaining permission from the student. In accordance with FERPA regulations, Stockton defines directory information as:

- Student name
- Campus telephone number
- Program of Study
- Grade level classification (freshman, sophomore, junior, senior, graduate)
- Enrollment status (full time or part time)
- Dates of attendance
- · Degrees awarded
- Honors
- Certifications
- Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- The most recent educational agency or institution previously attended by the student.

Grades and other personally identifiable information cannot be released to parents, guardians or other interested parties without specific written permission from the student. Stockton does not fax student educational records, including transcripts. In addition, transcripts received from other schools are the property of Stockton and are not copied or released. for any reason.

FERPA AND PARENTS

When a student reaches the age of 18 or begins attending a postsecondary institution, regardless of age, FERPA rights transfer from the parent to the student. Parents must obtain a signed consent form from their child to receive non-directory information. The Office of the Registrar keeps that consent on file. Parents may access student records if the student is claimed as a dependent on their most recent Federal income tax form and they submit this legal proof of dependency (IRS Code of 1954, Section 152) and a completed Release of Academic & Financial Records to Parent and/or Other Third Party form.

Many offices on campus require their own FERPA waivers. Your student must connect with the office of interest to complete a waiver and grant a family member access to personal information

Financial Aid Information and Loan Repayment Update

The 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available beginning Oct. 1, 2022. File early to be considered for all aid programs for the 2023-2024 academic year, including those with limited funding! File at fafsa.gov!

Loan Repayment Pause Extended; Targeted Debt Cancellation Plan Announced

The Federal Student Loan Payment Pause, which includes a suspension of loan payments, a 0% interest rate and stopped collections on defaulted loans will remain in effect through 12/31/22.

In addition, qualifying borrowers may be eligible for a one-time debt cancellation of up to \$10K. Prior Pell Grant recipients could receive up to \$20K in debt cancellation. Borrowers earning less than \$125,000 for individuals and less than \$250,000 for households are eligible to participate in the program. The Department of Education will release more information on how the debt cancellation plan will operate in the coming weeks.



Upcoming Financial Aid Reminders

The remaining due dates for a payment plan will be Oct 3rd and Nov 1st.

The Office of Financial Aid will be begin processing student refunds in the middle of October. Refunds are sent by regular mail through the US Post Office to the mailing address on the student's record and may take 7-10 days for delivery. Direct Deposits can also be set up through our appointment booking system.










Galloway Campus Map
