Galloway, NJ – Stockton University Kramer Hall and the Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton have partnered with the South Jersey Culture and History Center and the Town of Hammonton to host an exhibition focusing on the theme of agriculture in Hammonton as a part of the town's Sesquicentennial.

Kramer Hall and the Noyes are asking the community to consider sharing relevant historical items that they own which relate to any of the agriculture industries located in Hammonton. For example, items, documents or photographs might relate to farming, machinery, workers and the crop industries.
