Hurricane Harvey Prompts New NSF Research Efforts

The National Science Foundation (NSF) has recently announced a new proposal supporting fundamental science and engineering research projects related to issues raised by Hurricane Harvey. Through a recent [Dear Colleague Letter \(DCL\)](#), NSF is soliciting for research proposals that allow the country to better prepare for, respond to, recover from, or mitigate future catastrophic events. Funds support projects that enhance comprehensive understanding of storm effects, including physical, biological and societal factors. NSF is also interested in research on emergency response methods, and methods to mitigate future damage.



The DCL supports three types of awards:

- Rapid Response Research (RAPID) focusing on projects with severe urgency with regard to availability of, or access to, data, facilities or specialized equipment, including quick-response research on natural disasters.
- Early-concept Grants for Exploratory Research (EAGER)
- supporting efforts to conduct fundamental research representing exploratory work in its early stages on untested, but potentially transformative, research ideas or approaches.
- Supplemental funding requests to existing awards, up to six months of additional support.

Proposals are accepted at any time. Before submitting, contact the NSF program officer most related to the project topic. The DCL includes a list of contacts from each NSF directorate who can help determine whether your project is appropriate for this effort.
